Jillian Matundan became a musician at a young age when she began training as a classical violinist at the age of three. She has also been trained on piano, flute, and sitar, and is self-taught on numerous other instruments. She'll play guitar for her showcase.

Jillian has performed all over, from the Eastern Shore of Maryland to Cebu in the Philippines, and was a founding member of the locally beloved and internationally ignored band *Dancing for Nickels* in her home town of Syracuse, NY.

She plays violin and string bass in the Reston Community Orchestra (https://restoncommunityorchestra.org/) and the McLean Symphony (https://mclean-symphony.org/), and recently joined the PanTones Steel Band (http://www.pantonesband.com) in DC. She is also a member of Team in Training (https://www.teamintraining.org/), and has headlined a number of benefit concerts for her cycling team in Albany, NY, with local musicians and bands.

After a long hiatus of writing music and performing, Jillian started writing again last summer, and began doing open mics in the area in January. It was a Dar Williams songwriting retreat last August that provided the songwriting spark. She is working on an album and hopes it will be released by the fall.

Jillian works in the labor movement and volunteers with Homeward Trails Animal Rescue in her spare time.

The MSG Acoustic Trio performs traditional Piedmont blues in the style of Archie Edwards, Etta Baker, and Cephas & Wiggins. This band can raise the roof with some old-fashioned house party tunes, make you laugh with their witty originals, and then make you weep with blues ballads!

A typical performance goes from humorous foot-stompers to the deepest expression of the blues, with a whole lot of musical stops in between. These multitalented musicians wield a wide variety of instruments, but primarily it's Jackie Merritt on harmonica, bones, and ukulele, Miles Spicer on guitar, and Resa Gibbs on lead vocals and washboard. They have also had the honor of performing on the Kennedy Center's Millennium Stage. Their 2017 release, *The Flood*, received a firstround Grammy nomination under the category of Best Traditional Blues Album.

Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
