

Songs for Our Planet – The Earth

In July and August, The Folk Club does not schedule concerts, since attendance can be limited due to busy summer schedules. So, beginning in the summer of 2016, on nights when there would have been a concert, we began suggesting a theme to follow. We asked that musicians try to develop song sets that fit within the theme, and we've thus heard songs that are not often performed at The Folk Club. The theme nights have inspired enjoyable and memorable music that is sometimes unexpected, and always fun for all. This month is no different.

"A folk song could save the world" – Margaret Mead, 1972

The folk music revival in the 1950's and 60's was partly inspired by activism, with lyrics that most often expressed political views in support of the struggle for rights being demanded by social movements. These were known as "protest songs." Woody Guthrie, Pete Seeger, Phil Ochs, Bob Dylan, and Tom Lehrer are the best known writers of such songs.

They and countless other songwriters occasionally expressed a deep appreciation of Mother Nature, and very often a concern for our stewardship of the environment. These are the types of songs we would like performers to bring and share with us this month.

It might take a little more thought and digging for musicians to come up with material relevant to the theme. Possible sources of inspiration are the "Ecology" section in the "Rise Up Singing" songbook and YouTube searches for songs about the environment and the Earth.

There are some very popular folk songs relating to the environment (by Joni Mitchell and John Prine, for example) and these might be played early in the night, so plan accordingly. Songwriters who have original songs that fit the bill won't have that problem.

Come and find out if Margaret Mead had it right.

While we're encouraging performers to present songs that fit The Earth theme, it's not required. However, we'll appreciate those who have sets built around it.

Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
