September 10 Showcase – Matt Slocum and the Gravel Road Band by Matt

Find out what's happening under the hood of the Gravel Road Band as Matt and the band perform for the monthly showcase. Our music travels the rural back roads, powered by Nancy Lisi's super-charged Englehardt bass. Always smooth and humming, it's food for the ears that nourishes the soul. There's horsepower to spare from the precision-tuned quad string pairs on John Relph's fiery mandolin. The fiddle is flammable, and fires on all cylinders - low or high BPM (think RPM, but cooler). Janine Lewis provides the octane. Matt Slocum, the guitar man, sings, arranges, and slides the band into gear to spin the tires - and burn the rubber - that is bluegrass on the Gravel Road.



This spring, Matt Slocum released an EP, *Shaken and Stirred, Songs for a Fiddleman*, to highlight Claude Martin's fine bluegrass fiddle playing. Claude was a soloist with the Gravel Road Band before his untimely passing in 2016. The EP is available on major outlets like iTunes and Amazon. Check it out for a taste of Matt's songwriting and Claude's heavenly chops on the fiddle.

Matt and Nancy are very involved with the DC music scene. Matt's been a member of the DCBluegrass Union Board for 5 years and is neck deep in promoting the local bluegrass community. He's also worked diligently for The American Heart Foundation's annual HeartWalk event, raising in excess of fourteen thousand dollars to promote heart healthy research and medicine.

Nancy Lisi holds Board positions for both the Bluegrass Country Foundation and the Folklore Society of Greater Washington, keeping their communications flowing. How she finds the time to play in five bands as well will always be a source of mystery.

From Cabot, Vermont – Americana-roots and folk duo, Dana and Susan Robinson are celebrating the release of their new recording, *The Town That Music Saved.*

Dana and Susan combine vivid, songwriting and storytelling, with fiddle tunes, banjo grooves, elegant melodies, and rich harmony singing. Their compositions have been featured in Ken Burns's "The National Parks, America's Best Idea" and "The Dust Bowl." *Seven Days* writes, "Dana is a master storyteller, spinning his yarns with the precise skill of an artisan loom weaver."

Drawing upon experiences of more than twenty years of touring, Dana and Susan craft a performance that conveys the mystery and wonders of their journey. Their unique blend of original songwriting and traditional Appalachian music, bring to their performances a deep understanding of America's musical heritage. A native of the Pacific Northwest, Dana relocated to New England where he discovered both a thriving songwriters scene and the deep well of traditional mountain music. Dana launched into full-time touring after the release of his 1994 debut CD, Elemental Lullabye, and after receiving a request to perform at Carnegie Hall in New York City for Putumayo's Shelter benefit project.

Susan grew up with her dad's jazz big band rehearsing in the basement in Manchester, Vermont and learned classical piano as a child. As an adult she turned to oboe and Scottish fiddle. After Susan and Dana met in 2002, she took up old-time banjo. Since 2003 Dana and Susan have performed hundreds of concerts across the United States, Great Britain and Canada.

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
