This year we can't give you free dessert, raffle off slightly used CD's, or see you face to face in your holiday attire, but we'll be swapping seasonal songs in a round robin format on Zoom, and everyone can join in on YouTube.

Conversation Time During Our Weekly Open Mic

Something has been missing from our weekly virtual open mic sessions: socializing with each other as we did at the Amphora. OK, you're right, we're missing many things, but we can't fix everything. Anyway, we're going to see if we can provide a time for conversation on Tuesday night, by allowing interested members to join Zoom for a short time to talk with their Folk Club friends, and let everyone know how they are doing. Note that this is especially for those who usually watch on YouTube that we haven't seen - performers on Zoom are already seen and heard.

We want to try this and see if it works, so the trial balloon will go up on December 8th. After a few songs we'll open up the floor and Connee Chandler (who suggested the idea) will lead the conversation. How long is TBD, but probably not more than 30 minutes. When I send my invitation for performers on Sunday December 6th I'll also tell you how to sign up for the social time. Then on Tuesday the 8th I'll send the Zoom link and instructions to those who signed up.

The Return of the Monthly Member Showcase

Another item we've been missing with online open mics is the member showcase. The last one in March was Jeff Smith & The Human Wilderness String Band, and here we are 9 months later. Al Hobson asked if we could reintroduce them online, so we're going to try it. It will be a little different since we decided to limit the time to 15 minutes (4 songs?) – but that will feel like a luxury (right now we only do one song at a time) – and most performers will be solo (unless they are wise in the ways of Jamulus). We're planning to have the first one in January, probably on the 12th. Any musician who would like to play a showcase in January, please send an email entry to Connee Chandler (Connee22@verizon.net) before December 22. She'll do the drawing during our Holiday Party that night.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES (on hold)

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
