January Theme Night, Jan 12th – "Personal Memory" Songs

Each song will be one that instantly brings back a specific memory to the performer: like a first dance, or being with someone, or a certain place or time.

January 19 Showcase - Rick Landers by Rick

In 2018, singer-songwriter Rick Landers played his first public performance in over thirty years, after which the venue asked him to be its first featured singer-songwriter. Since then, he has been showcased or featured at house concerts, local venues, and festivals.

Rick has published <u>Guitar International magazine</u> since 2005 and is currently developing his performer site (<u>www.ricklanders.com</u>). His music is not fixed in any particular genre, and includes road songs, quiet ballads, songs with clever twists, and songs of love and loss.

Most days, Rick plays vintage acoustic guitars that include a 1931 Gibson (L-00), a 1946 Gibson (J-45), and his latest find, a 1964 single-owner Gibson J-200. This fall he



served as a judge for the Songwriters Association of Washington (SAW) for two songwriting categories, country and Americana contemporary.

January 12th - Theme Night - "Personal Memory" Songs

Have you ever heard a song that evokes the same memory every time you hear it? I'm pretty sure everyone who loves music has certain songs that trigger a memory of someone they were with, or where they were and what they were doing. For this theme night, we'd like our performers to briefly tell us what memory the song triggers in them, and then play it for us. It should make for an interesting night of music and appeal to armchair psychologists.

Conversation Time – January 19th – Early in the Open Mic

We tried this for the first time on December 8^{th} and it went well (<u>YouTube link</u> - if you haven't seen it). We saw members who we haven't visited with for quite a while, and it was good to hear how they are doing. So we are going to continue doing this when Connee Chandler is MC – usually every three weeks.

We'll do it again on January 19th, which is also a showcase night. So after a few songs Connee will open up the floor and lead the social time conversation. This time about 20 minutes, followed by Rick's showcase.

When I send my invitation for open mic performers for that week, I'll also tell those who want to be included in the social time how to sign up. Then on Tuesday the 19th I'll send the Zoom link and instructions to those who signed up.
