January 9 Showcase – Nancy Truax

Nancy Truax grew up in East Tennessee, living at various times in Chattanooga, Knoxville, and Maryville. She joined the Coast Guard at the age of 21, and enjoyed a long and varied career, stationed in places like Hawaii, Alaska, California, and DC. She started out as a Morse Code operator and ended her Coast Guard career as a criminal defense attorney, representing Coast Guard members whose court-martial convictions were up on appeal. After retiring from the Coast Guard, Nancy started her own military law practice, representing military members from all branches of service in various criminal and administrative proceedings.


Nancy considers herself more of a singer than a guitar player. She got her first guitar when she was 11 and she's still trying to figure out how to play it (she identifies strongly with the character Phoebe from "Friends" who describes chords by their hand shapes — i.e., "bear claw"). Her favorite artists are Joni Mitchell, Paul Simon, James Taylor, and Jethro Tull.

Several years ago Nancy and Greg Vickers did some impromptu playing and singing, and agreed that they should do it again sometime. Then in 2009 Greg invited Nancy to come to the Folk Club to do a few songs with him for his showcase, and that was the first time she ever performed in public. Greg and Nancy continued to play together, and soon they were joined by Matt Larson and formed the West Market Trio playing in various places around the Northern Virginia/DC area including the Columbia Heights Community Market, the Lake Anne Farmers' Market, Bangkok Blues, the Bluemont Fair, and, of course, the Folk Club of Reston-Herndon. They do an eclectic mix of bluegrass, traditional music, and folkie versions of classic rock numbers, and love to arrange vocal harmonies, usually built around Nancy's powerful voice. Regrettably, Matt is out of town, so this showcase will feature Nancy and Greg performing as a duo.

Nancy lives in Reston, Virginia with her husband Wayne and their Beagle/Jack Russell mix Joey. Joey likes to listen to the West Market Trio practice, and occasionally sings along (his favorite song is John Phillips' Topanga Canyon).

The Honey Dewdrops are the Virginia-based roots duet of Laura Wortman and Kagey Parrish. With a blend of new Americana and traditional folk music. they create inspired songs that are rooted in the experience and lives of people. Their sound is transcendent; they write all their own songs and yet no one could ever peg them as just another singersongwriter couple, not when they've embedded a sparse Appalachian clarity on every track that is accessible to listeners everywhere. The songs they write shine with energy and emotion through intimate performances with a handful of acoustic instruments and tightly layered harmonies.

On stage, the Honey Dewdrops focus on dynamically blending the sounds of instruments and voices by singing and playing into a single microphone. There is a high lonesome quality to the way their voices blend that is familiar, yet the mixture is unique. Their music covers the ground between hand crafted folk songs, Appalachian fiddle tunes, and a cappella spirituals. In their own way, the duo fills up a room with sound and feeling that lingers long after the show is over.

Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time. On the 2nd Tuesday of the month, we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to newsletter editor Bob Hampton at bhampton@ossva.com.
