## January 14 Showcase – Kathleen Huber

My first visit to the Folk Club was circa 1990. Bill Staines was performing the night we just happened to be at the Tortilla Factory for dinner. "Roseville Fair" remains etched in my mind, his gentle finger picking and sweet lyrics about falling in love resonate still. I admired his talent but never imagined being a musician. It would be ten years before I got my first guitar and another ten before I believed making music could be a part of my life.

Singing was always a part of my life though it was reserved for my Kindergarten bus driver ("Rain Drops Keep Falling on My Head") and those hours when I was alone. "Heart of Gold" was an early favorite and I wished it would play continuously on the radio rather than once per night. In high school, it was anything by Stevie Nicks and Linda Ronstadt. My college years were devoted to music that wasn't lyrical and by grad school I was into the poetic lyrics of Suzanne Vega (the line: "today I am a small blue thing" still makes me wonder: what ta?) and the classics of Patsy Cline ("You Belong to Me" is my all-time favorite). But it wasn't until I had children that I truly found my voice. After nightly reading the lights would go out and there would be singing until I couldn't remember any more verses or my two dearest were sleeping. There were the old songs my mother sang to me along with favorites I'd collected

through the years. Their favorite, "Come by the Hills", has this wonderful line: "and the cares of tomorrow must wait 'til this day is done." When our daughter was eight, we got her a small guitar for Christmas and my husband surprised me with my own guitar. He told me that he'd already asked Kim Melton if she would help me learn to play it and the rest, as they say, is history.

In 2010, Kim invited me to join her and a friend, Chris Anderson, for a jam. I hadn't done much with music for eight years because of some health issues, but that afternoon was a real turning point. As this community knows, Kim and Chris are remarkable women and I feel blessed to be a part of their circles. In Ladies Done Waiting we have enjoyed not only our music and harmonies but the beauty of true friendship and the power of a good belly laugh. I am eternally grateful for having 'found' these women. It is, I believe, pure grace that brought us together.

Since the birth of LDW, songwriting has become my creative outlet. I love words and have written for years (journals, poems, two novels—that will never be published, short stories—one was published, essays—one appeared in the Washington Post). As an editor for a science journal, writing songs is a nice balance to my day job.

This is the third time I entered the showcase drawing, twice for LDW and this time for me. And so it is: this showcase will be my originals with the help of a few friends. **Andrew Acosta** will play lead guitar, **Ted Johnson** will be on the bass, and **Kim Melton** will assist with guitar and harmony. I'll be on the uke. Hope you enjoy it.

The genius of a **Dana and Susan Robinson** performance lies in their ability to capture the imagination of their audience, evoking a transformative experience that touches on the deepest humanity. They can make the audience howl with laughter or hush with poignant reflection as they take them on a journey across America and convey the mystery and wonder of the places they visit.

Underpinning the songs is the undeniable rhythm of their trademark guitar/banjo sound. Whether it is guiet or driving, there is a steady and unrelenting groove to the music that supports the lyric and delivers the story in an effortless and magical way.

A native of the Pacific Northwest, Dana relocated to New England where he discovered both a thriving songwriters scene and the deep well of traditional mountain music. In the early 1980's, Dana settled in northern Vermont and built a house "off the grid" (no



border. There he founded a popular bakery, café and folk music venue. Dana launched into full-time touring after the release of his 1994 debut CD, Elemental Lullabye, and after receiving a request to perform at Carnegie Hall in New York City for Putumayo's Shelter benefit project.

Sue grew up in a musical family in New England. She studied piano, oboe, and Scottish fiddle before meeting Dana in 2002. Sue was working in the environmental field in California when she met Dana at a house concert. Upon moving to North Carolina a short time thereafter, Sue launched into studying with many of the great oldtime musicians in the Asheville area, and naturally adapted to the on-the-road lifestyle.

"Many songwriters such as Bruce Springsteen, or John Mellencamp have been heralded as modern day Woody Guthries or keepers of the American rural spirit, but that mantle might be better entrusted to musicians like Dana Robinson who embody both the heart and the soul of folk music." — Dirty Linen

Founded in 2008 by former AOL exec David Butler (when he couldn't find a good jazz guitar teacher nearby), it has grown into a virtual online campus of instructors in music of all varieties, and even includes voice and art instruction courses.

This course is specifically designed for someone who is unfamiliar with, but who desires to learn from the ground up how to play the instrument. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
