RESTON-HERNDON FOLK CLUB ANNOUCES UPCOMING 25th BIRTHDAY

Herndon, VA – After 25 years as the premier listening venue for folk and acoustic music in the Washington, DC area, the **Folk Club of Reston-Herndon** is gearing up for a special celebration at their annual birthday party, to be held May 25th at the **Tortilla Factory**, where the Club has gathered each Tuesday for the past (nearly) 23 years. Though some things have changed since **Rose Haskell** first established The Club in May of 1985, the spirit of our founders is still alive in the camaraderie and appreciation of music that we share.

There have been some notable changes in the past year, which deserve a special mention:

- **Chris Kramer-Harnage** (a.k.a. 'Fang') assumed the responsibility of booking our monthly concerts, taking over from **Ray Kaminsky** (who held the position for so long that no one seems to remember when he started.) With Chris's expertise and enterprising facility, the concert schedule was promptly filled up for the ensuing year-and-a-half!
- Ray Kaminsky stepped down as President of The Folk Club. He and his wife, Ellen Kaminsky are preparing to leave the vicinity and go on extended "walkabout" (or "driveabout") in search of America (and possibly further.) Both Ray and Ellen will remain members of the Folk Club Board of Directors. We wish them all the best in their quest, and hope to stay in touch.
- **Ben Hamblin** was elected President of The Folk Club in a special meeting of the Board of Directors (its first in almost living memory.) We all wish to extend our thanks to Ben for offering his service in this position, and feel confident that he will help to maintain and enhance our experience at The Club.
- **Laura Schier** was elected to the Board of Directors. As the youngest member of the board, Laura has a keen eye on bringing new, younger audiences into the fold, and helping to promote the appreciation of The Club Experience with a new generation.

SAMUEL JAMES is a performer of stunningly singular talent. A master of fingerstyle, slide, banjo, harmonica, and piano, this phenom is not yet out of his twenties. With musical influences ranging from Skip James and Sonny Terry to Gus Cannon and Charley Patton, such understanding of pre-war blues is rarely embodied in the music of one person.

But Samuel James is not a revivalist. His songwriting is absolutely unparalleled in contemporary blues. His writing is descended from the long forgotten art of the songster. While musically one could compare him to Patton or Cannon, his writing goes in another direction entirely. His songs are often written as linear stories, novels in musical format: O. Henry meets Mose Allison.

James' musical lineage stretches back to immediate postslavery. His grandfather (b. 1890) played guitar in contemporary blues styles of the era. James' father was a professional pianist, and trombone player. Samuel learned to tap dance at five, learned piano at eight and toured the Northeastern circuit professionally by 12. Samuel lost his mother the same year and spent his teens in foster homes. At 17 he reunited and rekindled a relationship with his father.



Samuel James fully discovered his musicianship after a young woman broke his heart. He booked a flight to Ireland figuring the gray and rainy climate would match his mindset. Short of funds to make it home, he learned harmonica from local street musicians. Collecting enough change to make it back to Maine, he gave up a nascent painting career and dove head first into the guitar. Today, still in his 20s, James has been nominated the 2010 Blues Music Award - Acoustic Artist of the Year and releases his third CD entitled For Rosa, Maeve, and Noreen which also received a nomination for Acoustic Album of the Year.

"Samuel James was born about 50 years too late. With his slide guitar, scratchy vocals and vintage songwriting, he sounds like Robert Johnson's little brother."

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
