March 8 Showcase – Tom Bodine

Tom Bodine last did a showcase in July of 2008. Some of the highlights of the profile he wrote for us then are:

I have always loved music. My earliest musical memory dates back to 1962 when I was a kid growing up outside of Scranton, PA and heard The Beatles "Love Me Do" on the radio at a friend's house. I was hooked. Later, following a move to the New York metropolitan area, I spent many a night tuned to 770 on the AM dial listening to "Cousin Brucie" (DJ Bruce Morrow) spinning tunes on WABC out of NYC. From Ultimate Spinach to The Monkees, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young to Hendrix and The Lovin' Spoonful, I'd listen to most anything coming in over the air waves or that I could get my hands on...

Fifth grade presented the opportunity to take drum lessons and join the school band. Shortly thereafter "The Advanced Project" was born, featuring guitar, drums, and vocals... with go-go dancers... With the addition of bass guitar and keyboards along the way, The Advanced Project continued into junior high as did my participation in the school band, but by the end of junior high I was getting into other things and soon ended up quitting both...

Fast forward to upstate NY—senior year of college and my roommate shows up with a guitar he'd learned to play over the summer. Not to be outdone, I... picked up a cheap lefty ax... Then a singer friend of mine cajoled me (after too many beers) into agreeing to perform with her at an open mic... "Tom & Monica" continued to perform open mics and paid gigs at various DC-metro area venues for a few years...

Lately I've been finding myself gravitating towards songs that tell a story. With a daily hour and a half round-trip commute to work, I spend a lot of time listening to channel 15 "The Folk Village" on XM Satellite radio. I feel fortunate to have discovered the Folk Club with all the wonderful performers and nice folks who show up every week to share their talents and love of music. It's so nice to be able to play at a place where people pay attention and listen...

Tom just got back from his first cruise, the Cayamo music love-fest that a lot of other Club members also went on (<u>http://www.cayamo.com</u>). He had a great time, and is now turning his attention to his showcase. There may be several guests on stage with him, and **Steve Iorio** on guitar is already confirmed.

Welcome back for your second showcase, Tom, it's been too long!

Mary McCaslin represents an unbroken link between traditional folksingers and today's "new folk" singer-songwriters. Her music ranges from ballads of the old west to her own songs of the new west and modern times. Regarded as a pioneer of open guitar tunings, and known for her distinctive vocal style, Mary's influences can be heard in many younger folk performers.

She is also known for her haunting renditions of pop standards and rock classics, such as "Ghost Riders In The Sky", "The Wayward Wind", the Beatles' "Things We Said Today", and the Supremes' "My World Is Empty". Her versions of the Beatles' "Blackbird" and the Who's "Pinball Wizard" are made more unique by her "clawhammer" banjo accompaniment.

Mary's musical influences are as varied as her repertoire: The western ballads of Marty Robbins, the guitar playing of Joan Baez and Joni Mitchell, the singing and banjo playing of Hedy West, and the vocal inflections of the Beatles and the BeeGees.



Her songs have been recorded by Tom Russell ("Prairie In The Sky"), Bill Staines ("Prairie In The Sky"), Cris Williamson ("Circle Of Friends"), David Bromberg ("Young Westley"), Kate Wolf ("The Ballad Of Weaverville"), Stan Rogers ("Down The Road"), Kate MacLeod ("Way Out West") and others. The Grand Canyon Railroad has used her song "Last Cannonball" for its promotional television ad.

Pennywhistle While You Work

Though working on the International Space Station can be exciting, there's still plenty of time to spend on recreational hobbies. To that end, when astronaut **Catherine "Cady" Coleman** blasted off last November for her 3rd trip into space, she brought with her some of her favorite musical instruments. Along with her own personal flute, she brought 3 other very notable instruments: A pennywhistle from **Paddy Moloney** (of The Chieftains), an old Irish flute from **Matt Malloy** (also of The Chieftains), and a flute from **Ian Anderson** (of Jethro Tull). In a recent interview for NPR's *All Things Considered* program, Cady spoke about her flutes, and even played a couple of the instruments for the show. SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to newsletter editor Bob Hampton at <u>bhampton@ossva.com</u>. 
