March 11 Showcase – Celtic Union

Just in time for Saint Patrick's Day comes Celtic Union, playing their unique brand of Irish music with an American twist. Celtic Union is currently a duo consisting of Jeff Walthall on

guitar, vocals, and Irish tenor banjo, and **TM Hanna** on mandolin and sometimes guitar.

Jeff has been performing since high school, first on drums, and then switching to guitar. About twenty years ago he teamed up with his brothers to form the Flying Cows of Ventry, which quickly became one of the more popular Irish bands in the DC area.



TM began his performing career in 1975 as an opening act for a rock band. A frequent performer at the Folk Club in the past, members familiar with his originals and Americana repertoire may not have heard this side of his playing.

Celtic Union performs at Irish Pubs in the Northern Virginia and DC Metro region, including The Auld Shebeen in Fairfax, The Old Brogue in Great Falls, O'Sullivans' here in Herndon, and now, by special arrangement, at the Auld Faulk O'Club!

Michael Peter Smith lives in Chicago and is well known for writing "*The Dutchman*," popularized by Steve Goodman. He has been singing and composing since the 1960s, and his rich and challenging songs have been recorded by more than 30 performers. His work has also included the score for the Steppenwolf Theater Company's Broadway production of *The Grapes of Wrath*. Other recordings include a live coffeehouse album, the long out-of-print *Juarez*, which, strictly speaking, is not a Michael Smith album, but a trio (known as *Juarez*) comprised of Smith, Ron Kickasola, and his wife, Barbara Barrow Smith. In 2002, his pleasantly understated *There* was released on Wind River Records. During the new millennium, Smith has continued a quite active schedule of performing and recording in a variety of contexts, issuing his live recording *Such Things Are Finely Done* in 2003 and *Just Plain Folk*, a duo effort with John McDermott, in 2005, while also collaborating on theater productions that in some cases also resulted in album releases, such as 2003's Michael Smith's *The Gift of the Magi* and 2008's *The Selfish Giant*, featuring music penned and performed by Smith for a puppet show that launched the 2007-2008 season of the Chicago Children's Theater. Meanwhile, Smith composed the music and performed in a chamber folk opera version of Hans Christian Andersen's *The Snow Queen* which began a multiple-year run at Chicago's Victory Gardens Biograph Theater in 2006. Though sometimes elusive to the spotlight, Smith has had a long, eclectic career as a musician. His songs are played and known throughout the world. Considered by his peers to be one of today's most intelligent, literate songwriters it is a wonder he managed to stay hidden to so many others for so long. The 78 Project

Inspired by Alan Lomax's journeys to record Appalachian folk music as played in its natural environment by the people who breathed life into it, the duo of **Alex Steyermark** and **Lavinia Jones Wright** have been at work for the past few years recreating Lomax's recording technique in a modern setting.

To accomplish this, they located and purchased a vintage 1930's Presto recording machine, which records through a single microphone directly onto a blank lacquer disk. In settings from New York to Florida they collected recordings from a myriad of performers such as Mary Chapin Carpenter, Roseanne Cash, Richard Thompson, Loudon Wainwright III, Marshall Crenshaw, and a host of others. Each artist gets a single take in this direct-to-disk technique, which brings an immediacy and intimacy to the recordings that is not available in a typical studio session.

The first pressing of their recordings, *The 78 Project: Volume 1*, is already sold out, though the digital album is available for download at iTunes and Amazon. A movie about the project will be debuted at the SWSX Film Festival in Austin, TX, March 7-15.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
