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April 13 Showcase - Scott Paul Laurenza

Scott Paul Laurenza grew up in Falls Church but moved to the Oakton area in time to go to James Madison High School. His father, who played the organ, taught him to read music and play the piano. In high school he listened to some reggae and his Dad's '70s record collection, picked up the autoharp, and eventually moved on to guitar and songwriting.

Scott has always been active in sports and outdoor recreation. He started snowboarding, mountain biking, and kayaking in this area, and chose to go to Colorado State University in Fort Collins to enjoy the mountains. There he met some musicians and heard numerous artists and bands that toured through the western US, including reggae groups.

He was drawn to world music, and studied African drumming. Some other students introduced him to Ballroom and Latin Dance, and this became another passion.

After college, Scott moved to western Colorado and worked as a Park Ranger at the Black Canyon of the Gunnison. He also traveled through the Southwest and Northwest in a motor home during the off season for the Park Service. After living in Hawaii and Florida, he took a job on the Mississippi River working for the Park Service at Effigy Mounds. There he met a Native American family who offered to rent their home in western New York to him while they were away on a work project, so Scott lived on the Seneca Indian Reservation near Niagara Falls for a while.

The progressive music scene in the DC area drew him back home in 2006, and he got into dancing again, teaching full time at Arthur Murray and competing on an advanced salsa performance team. He scaled that back, now teaching dance, yoga, and tennis part time for the Fairfax County Park Authority, freeing up some nights to pursue music.

Scott plays guitar, keyboards, harmonica, the wooden flute, and several percussive instruments including the djembe and conga drums. He also plays an Indian instrument known as the harmonium, which is a small portable acoustic organ used by classical and devotional singers in India. He's joined some local reggae musicians and plans to have a band ready by this summer. You can hear some of his music at http://www.myspace.com/mystic_lion.

DEL REY from Seattle Washington, is a complex, pianistic guitarist, described as "a combination of Bo Carter and the Andrews Sisters" (Observant Fan). She started playing classical guitar as a four-year-old. In her teens, she met bluesman Sam Chatmon who inspired her to become a blues queen. Her guitar playing combines country blues, stride piano, classic jazz and hillbilly boogie through the sensibility of an autodidact trailor-park esthete. Her <u>live show</u> is full of complex guitar grooves and sly humor.

Del Rey plays concerts world wide and also presents a concert/lecture on women musicians called Women in American Music. She collaborates and tours frequently with Austin guitarist Steve James and she plays ukulele with Ukeshack. She is featured on Maria Muldaur's cd Sweet Lovin' Old Soul and has contributed to projects in honor of The Mississippi Sheiks, Sister Rosetta Tharpe and Johnny Cash. Del Rey also writes about music for various publications, including Acoustic Guitar.



Del Rey has recorded five solo albums, Blue Uke (Hobemian 2008), When The Levee Breaks (Hobemian 2006), X-Rey Guitar (Hobemian 2000), Hot Sauce (Hobemian 1995) and Boogie Mysterioso (Hobemian 1993). In 2003 she released a collection of performances Del Rey:Live.

Additionally, she recorded an album of uke 'n' bass instrumental duets with Matt Weiner At The Ukeshack #1(Hobemian 2007) and also on uke with The Yes Yes Boys she recorded Why Say No? (Hobemian 2002) With Steve James, Tonight (Hobemian 2004) and Twins (Hobemian 2002). With Del Rey and the Blues Gators she recorded Chartruese (Hobemian 1991) and Cafe Society (Kicking Mule 1985).
