A few words about my forthcoming showcase...



In Austin, Texas—a town overflowing with gifted singer/songwriters and guitar players— **Albert & Gage** -- Christine Albert & Chris Gage have a long track record of making beautiful music together, although both musicians' individual pedigrees are far more extensive. Over the course of six duet albums, the duo has demonstrated that disparate backgrounds do not preclude musical soul mates from finding one another.

In 2003 Albert and Gage released their first live recording, Albert and Gage at Anderson Fair. Dirty Linen commented that the set, which is reflective of their typical live performances, had "energy, humor, really fine duet singing, strong leads, original harmonies, a strong sense of partnership, personality, and musicality" and Sing Out! called it "a cohesive and exciting exploration of the roots of popular, mostly American, music". In the '80s, Chris enjoyed an eight-year tenure on piano with guitar virtuoso and country star Roy Clark, which included appearances on Hee Haw. The Tonight Show and The Grand Ole Opry.

After moving to Austin in 1991, Gage began commuting to San Antonio to take the reins as musical director for the Fiesta Texas theme park.

But it was during (and following) his next incarnation, as bandleader for West Texas alt.-country singer/songwriter Jimmie Dale Gilmore, that he began to carve out his own place in the Austin scene as an indemand session player, accompanist and producer. It was with Gilmore that Christine first heard Chris play and in 1997 Albert & Gage was formed. The duo later toured as an opening act for Gilmore and as members of his ensemble.

"There is an inevitable and welcome sweetness to the music of Christine Albert and Chris Gage, even when they choose to do a downer song. The sweetness is in their beautiful harmonies and the obvious onstage chemistry. Cry Love, their fifth duet CD in nine years, is a sort of gospel of love, looking at both fulfillment, loss, and yearning.

The duo wrote most of the dozen songs together, and do their own interpretations of John Hiatt's "Cry Love", Mickey Newbury's "I Still Love You", and Michael Austin's "Before I Go"..." read more

# Sound of Silence will never be Silenced

Simon & Garfunkel's 1966 hit Sound of Silence was recently selected by the Library of Congress as one of 25 recordings to be included in the National Recording Registry for 2012. The 25 recordings selected were chosen for being "culturally" or "historically" significant, and span a period in the 20th century between 1918 and

The announcement of the 2012 selections comes on the heels of the Library of Congress's recently unveiled "National Recording Preservation Plan", a congressionally mandated plan to "increase the accessibility of sound recordings for educational purposes."

Among the recordings selected this year were such memorable tunes as Mississippi Governor Jimmie Davis's You Are My Sunshine, the original cast recording of Rodgers and Hammerstein's South Pacific, Chubby Checkers The Twist, and Pink Floyd's Dark Side of the Moon.

# **Arhoolie Records 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**

Though Chris Strachwitz has been running the Down Home Music Store in El Cerito, CA for 37 years, he's been recording for longer than that under the Arhoolie label, starting in his Berkeley, CA living room. That happens to be where he recorded a young folk musician named Country Joe MacDonald in 1966. When Joe asked Chris how much he owed him for the session, Chris replied "Well, you don't owe me nothing, but can I be the publisher?" Joe agreed, and Chris didn't think about it until Joe went to play Woodstock and sang the now famous anthem "Feel Like I'm Fixin' to Die Rag", which he had recorded at the session with Chris. The first \$70K royalty check that came in eventually paid for Chris's new music store. Aside from this windfall, Chris hasn't made any huge sums from the recordings he's produced - he simply does it for love of the 'down home' style music he enjoys so much.
