June 8 Showcase – Tex Johnson and the Ramblers



Roger "Tex " Johnson started playing music when he was in junior high school and has had periods where he would go years without picking up an instrument. Lately, though, he's had more time to play, and has had quite a lot of fun playing the 6 string bass with **The Ramblers.** He first heard them play at the Folk Club and had to look up to see who clipped the wings off those angels. Kathleen said she snipped them off herself! Kathleen has a great style on the 5 string banjo and Valeria, along with being a great singer, has impeccable timing, perfect pitch, and is a skilled plumber. All admirable quantities. Sherry has written some wonderful songs and continues to surprise with the many instruments that she can play. She smoked the room with her flute the other night, and he hopes to hear more of it!

Many bands have influenced Tex's style, among them Delbert McClinton, Willis Allan Ramsey, John Anderson, The Beatles, The Birds, and Bonnie Raitt just for starters. He has certainly enjoyed playing with The Ramblers and has high hopes that you will enjoy this, their Debut Showcase Performance as well! **You can also hear**

Guitar player and vocalist **Valeria Stewart** is originally from Buenos Aires, Argentina, and has always loved playing the guitar. Some recent favorite influences have been the Be Good Tonyas, Gillian Welch, Anne & Pete Sibley, Wailin Jennys, the Po Girls, Neil Young, and Uncle Earl. Singing and performing for an audience are still new to her, but she has spent recent years going to CABOMA jams, where she made friends with Kathleen and learned about the Folk Club. Once her songbird sister-in-law Sherry moved back to the area (after living out west), the two immediately bonded through a joy of singing and playing music together. Having Kathleen join up has been a bonanza. Her banjo, voice, and incredible energy have kept things rolling along nicely. Now with Tex to fill out the sound and complement their songs, The Ramblers have begun a whole new journey including many laughs so that no one takes themselves entirely seriously.

Banjoist **Kathleen Farrar** first became enamored with the banjo after hearing it at a wedding. She started honing her craft on a dime store banjo, perfecting the bluegrass tune "Little Liza Jane" over a period of 15 years. Upon relocating to Vienna in 1999 she stumbled upon the Folk Club and became inspired to take the banjo on in earnest. She started out by obtaining a Gibson Mastertone Earl Scruggs model banjo. Soon after, she appeared in her first Folk Club Showcase with the **Zen Gospel Trio**, a fine group of ladies (**Sue Schier** and **Diane LaFleur**) just released from prison and hell bent on redeeming themselves through music. Although there were many potential suitors hanging around the Folk Club in those days, Kathleen soon took up with **Bill Farrar** and became one of the many couples to hold the Folk Club wholly liable for their marriage. Most recently, Kathleen has taken up shop with The Ramblers, exploring all kinds of ways to "grass up" any song. Kathleen sites her influences as the legendary **Bob Fox**, multi-instrumentalist **TM Hanna**, and the ever-amazing duo of **Harney** and **Fang**.

Sherry Stewart grew up right here in Herndon and is an esteemed graduate of Herndon High School. She lived here until the wild winds came along and blew her out to Montana and Wyoming for the better part of her adult years (hence the name "The Ramblers"). About 5 years ago, a small contingent of Virginia Stewarts came to visit the Wyoming Stewarts in Jackson Hole, whereupon one dark starry night around the campfire, Valeria picked up her guitar and pulled out her tattered and torn copy of *Rise Up Singing*. It was a fun and memorable night of music which inspired Sherry to try her hand at playing guitar. After a series of group lessons, Sherry became friends with the instructor, who introduced her to a whole world of like-minded folks in Jackson. As in the old proverb "trouble comes in threes," Sherry met up with two great gals in Jackson who became dear friends and the three of them ultimately became regular performers at the world famous Jackson Hole Hootenanny. Now back in Northern Virginia (against her will), she owes a huge debt of gratitude to Valeria for turning her on to this wonderful and legal form of escape, and bringing her into yet another exceptional fold of musicians. Her influences? Sherry loves all kinds of music, and since she started playing guitar, her greatest influences have been the folks she's had the pleasure to play with!

MARY FLOWER, from Portland, Oregon, a 2008 Blues Music Award Nominee for "Acoustic Artist of the Year," is renowned for a uniquely personal vision of roots music that blends ragtime, acoustic blues, and folk styles. Technically dazzling yet grounded in the down-to-earth simplicity of early 20th century American music, she boasts more stylistic diversity than just about any other artist currently performing under the "acoustic blues" banner.

Flower has earned rave reviews from critics and audiences alike for her natural, unassuming vocals, but it's her instrumental skill - a mastery of the difficult Piedmont blues guitar style that takes most players a lifetime to hone - for which Flower is most celebrated. Her fingerpicking forms the basis of a heavily syncopated, ragtime-based style wherein the thumb plucks a strong rhythmic base as the fingers etch



out the melody. She also excels at lap slide guitar, allowing her to infuse her songs with a supremely delicate, plaintive sound that's hers alone while recalling the blues giants of the past.

Flower finished in the top three at the National Fingerpicking Guitar Championship and appeared on radio programs such as A Prairie Home Companion and played at numerous folk and blues festivals including the Kerrville Folk Festival, King Biscuit Blues Festival, and Merlefest. Flower has eight albums under her belt, including the critically acclaimed Bywater Dance, a tribute to New Orleans and recorded in the Bywater district of the city following Hurricane Katrina. Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time. On the 2^{nd} Tuesday of the month, we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to newsletter editor Bob Hampton at <u>bhampton@ossva.com</u>. 
