
JOHN MCEUEN

Member of the Nitty Gritty Dirt Band (now in their 44th year) **JOHN MCEUEN** has continually performed since 1964 - 8,500 concerts and 300 television shows throughout more than 3 million miles - both with the band and as a solo performer. Beyond performing, he has a rich history of creating, producing and preserving original and traditional folk and acoustic music, and taking it to new audiences.

He brings his guitar, banjo, fiddle, and mandolin along with favorite Dirt Band songs and the stories behind them.

McEuen has made over 40 albums (6 solo) that have earned four platinum and five gold recognition awards, Grammy nominations, CMA and ACM awards, an Emmy nomination, IBMA record of the year award, and performed on another 25 albums as guest artist. He's also produced more than 300 concerts throughout his career the first in 1965 in Long Beach, CA, with Bob Dylan.

His production of Steve Martin's *The Crow: New Songs for the 5-String Banjo* won the 2010 Best Bluegrass Album Grammy. *The Music of the Wild West* CD - produced by McEuen, was honored with the Western Heritage Award. A Grammy nomination for String Wizards II preceded the1994 Uncle Dave Macon Award for his excellence in preservation and performance of historic music. In 2010 he was honored with the Best in the West Award from the Folk Alliance Organization. Since 2005, John's popular *Acoustic Traveller*



show has been on Sirius/XM's The Village. McEuen produced and directed the 2006 documentary film *The Dillards* - A Night in the Ozarks, which captures his early mentors at their best.

McEuen's countless jams include street performers to Phish, Earl Scruggs, Levon Helm... and even on Sesame Street with a herd of goats and a cow! Arguably, McEuen's most important legacy may be his instigation of what Rolling Stone called "The most important record to come out of Nashville" and what the 2004 ZAGAT survey called "the most important record in country music" - Will the Circle Be Unbroken.

Der Deutschen Bluegrass?



Most people remember Howard Caine as the actor who played Gestapo Major Hochstetter on the 60's TV show Hogan's Heroes. But did you know he had a second career as a banjo player?

According to his son, Lyle, Howard developed an interest in folk and traditional music that was

fostered to some degree by his interest and support of the Civil Rights movements, through which he met people like Pete Seeger, Cisco Houston, and Theodore Bikel. Taking up the banjo in the mid-60's, he had become proficient enough by 1970 to start playing professionally at clubs and festivals, and between then and his death in 1993 he had won trophies in 29 prominent banjo and fiddle contests, both for traditional banjo and traditional singing.

As far as his picking style went, Howard described it as Appalachian-style clawhammer banjo or frailing, and referred to a theory that the style was created by oldtime players in Appalachia to compensate for the difficulty in playing with arthritis. Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time. On the 2nd Tuesday of the month, we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
