Sam and Joe Herrmann are founding members of *Critton Hollow*, a mainstay of the string band scene in the US since 1975. Joe is well known in traditional music circles for his singing and as a multi-instrumentalist, playing fiddle, banjo, guitar and mandolin. He has been making music for over 45 years and is known for his patient and generous teaching. Sam is respected for her heartfelt traditional singing and tasteful renditions of old-time dance tunes on the hammered dulcimer. She became interested in the instrument in 1975, built a dulcimer and quickly became well known as a fine instrumentalist and old-time stylist. She is also a successful fiber artist raising sheep, spinning yarn and knitting at the Herrmann's home

in Paw Paw, WV. Critton Hollow has released 6 albums and Joe has several solo albums to his credit. Together, they have toured the nation and performed internationally as well.

"My first instrument was the 5-string banjo ala Pete Seeger and as a child of the '60s we actually had "hootenannies" in our back yard where we would play and sing the popular folk music of that era. In high school it was rock and roll which was a very healthy form at the time and an influence in my musical sensibilities. A bit later it was jazz and by 1974 I had sold all the electric guitars and amplifiers and moved to Paw Paw, WV with my Yamaha acoustic guitar. Discovered fiddle about that time. Rediscovered banjo. Music has been good to me, think I'll just keep it up".

Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time. On the 2^{nd} Tuesday of the month, we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to newsletter editor Bob Hampton at <u>bhampton@ossva.com</u>.
