November 8 Showcase – The Larry & Ron Show

"Hats off to Larry" was a 1961 top-ten hit for Del Shannon, and now we salute Larry Mediate with a Folk Club tip-of-the hat. I suggested that he enter the showcase lottery (nobody else had entered at the time), and he won the drawing as The Larry & Ron Show.

Former Folk Club president Larry lives in Herndon with his fabulous wife Bev and their little dog Jake. Being the "talent scout" and music impresario-promoter that I am, years ago I became interested in Larry's unforgettable originals, running the gamut from the ridiculous, satirical "Rat Race," poking fun at bureaucratic lawyers, and the sublime "Juan Aguilar," a solemn ballad based upon a news account of an innocent young victim of a tragic terrorist attack in Spain.

Larry, born and raised in Pennsylvania, has worn many hats. Some examples are these: He's run his own music store, worked in telecommunications, and works now at a Lowe's in a conscious effort to help customers with their home projects. He's got talent in martial arts too, so don't mess with him, but fortunately, he's a peace-loving man (ask him about his famous "angry" brother). In fact, Larry is known as THE Zen Consultant.

I became determined to *goad* my friend Larry into expanding his musical repertoire from his previous set list that included what I thought was too many slow songs and "whiny" Neil Young songs. I like for a show to include a variety of rhythms and moods. Since I encourage solo acts to collaborate and teach friends to accompany them, I thought Larry should do that, and it occurred to me he'd make a good bandleader. I was right! Since I've enjoyed being in many bands since 1964, I offered Larry some pointers; Larry took my challenge and went to unpredicted extremes! Instead of forming a simple small combo and making it easy for himself, he's invited a slew of musicians to become Zen Consultants for specific shows.

The Zen Consultants band has included many people, and this time **TM Hanna** and **Jean Bayou**, the president of The Songwriters' Association of Washington (SAW.org), and will join the fun. Larry and I currently serve on the SAW board.

Many of you know that I am indebted to autoharpist Todd Crowley for first bringing me to the Folk Club around 1995. Todd and I taught English and Creative Writing courses together at Centreville High School, and he lured me here to sing the part of The Cowardly Lion for "If I Only Had a Brain" from *The Wizard of Oz.* Soon after I came to the Folk Club, I met Dan Grove, who introduced me to many good people and to SAW. Before affiliating with the Folk Club, I did mainly tuxedo gigs with my band Nightmusic. Thanks to Todd, Dan, Larry, and so many others, I've been fortunate to be surrounded by the beautiful, sometimes wacky Folk Club family.

P.S. Larry says to come early! The first 25 attendees will receive free advice from Zen Consultants Larry and Ron! (But they reserve the option to pick the subject their advice addresses... maybe don't let your Mama dress you too funny that night, or get your feng shui in a bunch...;-)

Thirty years as a professional songwriter and traveling troubadour serve as credentials. As a solo performer, and as the trusted sidekick of Texas Americana songwriting icon Guy Clark, Verlon has viewed the world from stages everywhere from Barcelona to Binger (his hometown in Oklahoma).

Along the way Verlon Thompson compositions have been recorded by Jimmy Buffett and Alan Jackson, Anne Murray, The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Kenny Rogers, Randy Travis, Del McCoury, Sam Bush, Trisha Yearwood and many more.

Equally important in his songwriting and live performances, Verlon's guitar work cannot go unnoticed. His guitar can be heard on recordings by **Restless Heart**, **Pam Tillis**, and many more, including, and especially Guy Clark. Verlon has co-produced **Guy Clark's** Grammy nominated cd "Cold Dog Soup" as well as "The Dark", "Workbench Songs" and "Somedays the Song Writes You".

As the in-house musician for **Genuine Human Productions** (<u>genuinehuman.com</u>) Thompson scores themes and background music for documentaries and special film projects.

Verlon Thompson is currently on the road promoting his newest album "Works". Or in the studio. Or writing in his bunkhouse on the river in Tennessee...

....but never far from the fertile plains of Oklahoma.

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
