Since first discovering the Folk Club nearly two years ago, Jan feels extremely lucky to have become a part of this wonderful community of music-lovers and kindred spirits. Since her last showcase, 6 months ago (just under the wire – she checked with Ben to be sure she was eligible again before entering!), she has traveled to the West Coast & back, done her first 'cold water' SCUBA dive with her newly-certified daughter in great white shark-infested waters (didn't see any), survived appendicitis, and had several other strange misadventures to spice up her already unusual songwriting and storytelling topics. She still does poultry songs, too – keeping up her new role as the unofficial "Chicken-singer", but will include some others to keep the menu varied. Husband Neil will be joining her with his giant cheese slicer (hammered dulcimer) for several songs, as well. Her acoustic finger-picking style dates back to her

folk-singing beginnings in a Chicago area coffeehouse, during the great 'Folk Scare' of the 60s.

A retired high school science teacher turned avid story-teller/musician, her musical topics are drawn from her extremely unusual life for a girl who grew up in the Midwest; having become a scientist, sailor, research SCUBA diver, biologist, geologist, environmentalist, newspaper editor, science teacher, EMT and Hospice director – among other endeavors. She has been lost at sea without a boat (twice!), fallen asleep underwater (once), worked with American crocodiles, swum with sharks, gone through earthquakes, hurricanes, floods, and travelled around the US and as far away as Australia. Everywhere she went, on land or sea, music has always been a huge part of her life and a loving connection to the world around her!

Musical History Rescued

In the wake of the folk music revival of the late 50's and 60's, people started becoming more aware of the importance of preserving the American traditional music that was becoming harder to find, as the older performers



who remembered it were beginning to die off. By the early 70's, action began to place take within Congress to assist in the preservation of folk music and traditions, and in 1976 passed the American Folklife Preservation Act.

One of the first to take up the challenge of music preservation at this time was Bobby Fulcher, a Tennessee State Park ranger and novice folklorist. Much material was collected by visiting the homes of Tennessee families like that of Opal Wright, daughter of the late 'Fiddlin' John Sharp. He also started spending spare time tracking down living musicians, such as Dee Hicks, who had more than 100 centuries-old melodies committed to memory. Every time he met and recorded one musician, they would point him on to others.

In order to handle the increased activity, he started obtaining federal grants, and hiring grad students like Betsy Petersen, teaching them how to work with the hill people by stepping back and allowing them to reveal themselves at their own pace. Betsy is now the Director of the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress, though Fulcher's original tape recordings are still housed in the archive vault where the State of Tennessee stores its most valuable historical treasures.

Fulcher has now launched Sandrock Recordings with the assistance of non-profit group Friends of the Cumberland Trail. So far nine albums have been released, and six more are in the works. More info can be found on their Facebook page: www.facebook.com/sandrockrecords.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
