## December 9 Showcase – Glen Hirabayashi

I was first exposed to music by my family singing in the car, because our car did not have a radio. Mom also played piano at church. I had my first music lessons in the 3d grade, learning how to play the ukulele. Later I was a terrible piano student. I played trumpet from the 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades, in a swing band and in the high school band. My ukulele teacher was the swing band leader. My first public singing experience was in college where I managed to get into the Glee Club which performed on the Ed Sullivan Show, the Hollywood Bowl, and many other neat venues.

I picked up a guitar just prior to graduating college, and figured out how it worked based on my rudimentary knowledge of the ukulele. During eight years in the Army and three years of law school, my music development remained rather static. During my first job as a lawyer, I met a fabulous musician who decided that we should start a band, and we did. I had to learn how to play the electric bass for this rock and roll band.

Following my wife to Washington, DC, and during further law education, I began to perform Hawai'ian music regularly for the first time with a troupe here. When our two daughters began to study hula about twenty years ago they needed live music. Out came the ukulele again. I seriously reconnected with that instrument at about the time The Aloha Boys were founded. Through my daughters' hula education, I learned more about Hawai'ian music and culture here than I did growing up in Hawai'i.



The Aloha Boys' little niche of live traditional and contemporary Hawai'ian music has taken us to unbelievable venues and performances for all kinds of audiences, including some rather famous people. The ride has been exhilarating for an untrained wannabe singer and musician like me.

I believe that I have a mission of spreading the ukulele love. I will share with anyone interested, anything and everything that I know about the ukulele. I thank the Reston Herndon Folk Club for allowing me to share my enthusiasm for the ukulele and music in general with such wonderful people and great musicians. You guys need to come over to our house and jam!

[Editor's Note: Glen was born on Oahu, but moved to Kaua'i when he was in the second grade. The ukulele lessons in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade were with Charlie Kaneyama, a legendary big band leader in the 1940s who came to the elementary schools on Kaua'i to teach it, and was later Glen's swing band leader in high school. Glen sang on Sullivan with the West Point Glee Club.]

### Jean Redpath

Jean Redpath, who died on Aug 21, 2014, is remembered as a singer and collector of Scottish songs. She lived in Elie, in the county of Fife, Scotland, and stayed in various places around the United States.

She began as one of the young singers who arrived in Greenwich Village in the early 1960s. For a while, according to histories of the era, she dated Bob Dylan. They slept on the floor of an apartment at One Sheridan Square with other folky hopefuls like Ramblin' Jack Elliott. She sang in a smooth, subtle vibrato, usually a cappella or delicately accompanying herself on a guitar.

Many Americans were familiar with her through frequent appearances on Garrison Keillor's popular public radio show, "A Prairie Home Companion," where her sense of humor sparkled. Garrison Keilor said of her ""A person doesn't make a life singing traditional Scottish music on the basis of charm. She has a fierce devotion to the music, as a Scot and as an artist. Everything she most deeply feels and believes in — about death and love and country and womanhood — comes out in these songs. The songs aren't pictures. They're rocks. They are the mountain itself."

She said she never liked being labeled a folk singer. "In fact," she said, "I avoid putting a label on anything. I just like to sing — it's an easier form of communication to me than talking."

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
