June 9 Showcase – Stevie Wade Potter

Steve "Stevie Wade" Potter was born in DC and has lived in Northern Virginia since. He went to Hayfield High School in Alexandria, and now lives in Haymarket. He has a wife and two children - a daughter, 25, and a son, 20. Steve worked for over 30 years for Verizon, first implementing internal computer and internet systems and then as a supervisory engineer for the FIOS fiber optic system.

Steve picked up a guitar in high school, and at age 20 began lessons for a couple of years with a classical fingerstyle player who was arranging Beatles songs on the guitar – "Blackbird" is one of the first songs he learned. He stopped playing until his early 30s, when he was impressed by Mississippi John Hurt, and found that his earlier classical fingerstyle technique worked with Piedmont and Delta Blues. Hurt, Reverend Gary Davis, Robert Johnson, and others influenced him tremendously.

After a while Steve got into electric guitar - Mark Knopler of Dire Straits is his favorite overall player,



with Muddy Waters tops for blues. When Steve heard James Cotton perform on harmonica he picked that up, too, and played both in an electric blues band called The Icemen for 20 years.

The next incarnation for Steve was when he discovered Doc Watson, Tony Rice, and Norman Blake about seven years ago – this called for flatpicking, which he learned to do. He's also tinkering with mandolin and lap steel guitar these days, always expanding.

Steve plays a lot of gigs, many wineries among them. Until last month he also hosted a showcase event at Deja Brew in Haymarket, but the restaurant has unfortunately closed. You can see his performing schedule and more at his website, http://www.StevieWadeMusic.com.

For his showcase, Steve plans to do songs you'll recognize from multiple genres and decades, accompanied by Tom Bodine, Kathleen Huber, and Nicole Belanus. See you on the 9th!

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
