May 10 Showcase - Ken Kunec

Ken was born in the middle of the previous century and his parents soon realized that they had a musical prodigy on their hands when, by the age of 2, he began playing the bagpipes. By the time he was 6 years old they entered him into competition on Ted Mack's Amateur Hour (the precursor of Star Search or American Idol during the black and white TV era). Unfortunately, he was eliminated when no song he played demonstrated a recognizable melody and the head judge proclaimed "Bagpipes......Are you kidding me?"!

His parents reacted by channeling his musical knowledge in another direction, but he began playing the banjo. By the time he reached middle school, they could stand it no longer and pleaded with him to switch to some other instrument (any

other instrument), whereby he selected the accordion.

By the time he started high school, he was occasionally playing at small weddings and house parties doing polkas, standards, and pop music. At the same time, he began playing electric organ and guitar with a garage band for fun.

During college years in the late 60s, he shifted almost exclusively to rock and roll bands, playing either bass guitar or a Hammond B3 organ at school dances and local clubs. They covered rock, R&B, and soul music of the Beatles, Stones, Beach Boys, Blood Sweat & Tears, Supremes, Temptations, Four Tops, Doors, Hendrix, etc.

After college, he came to the DC area and worked designing computer systems in the Department of Defense and the Treasury Department. Music performance became an afterthought as he and his wife raised a family and pursued their federal careers.

A few years ago, at the suggestion of his wife, Ken began playing the accordion for some church socials. As that evolved, he began playing at community events and then, at open mic sessions for fun. He is interested in promoting appreciation of the accordion as one of the more robust instruments that can be used by an entertainer. (If that fails, he intends to switch back to bagpipes). Ken plays an array of music genres including polkas, Italian songs, German, Irish, and Spanish music, 70s and 80s pop, Broadway tunes, and some jazz. He likes to refer to his accordion as "a carnival in a box."

Ken and his wife discovered the Folk Club a few years ago and quickly signed up as members. They especially appreciate the quality of our monthly concerts.

Dave Nachmanoff is a California-based performer with more than a dozen albums under his belt. He's known for his sophisticated songwriting, clean guitar-playing, rich and textured instrumentation, and top-notch singing. He's been described as having "an acoustic style that's somewhere between the easygoing charm of Arlo Guthrie and the raw energy of Bruce Springsteen." Dave's voice has been likened to an older Rob Thomas (Matchbox 20) and his guitar style to Mark Knopfler or Richard Thompson. He performs acoustic music influenced by a wide variety of styles and topics.

Dave is probably best known as a side player, but he's also an amazing solo performer in his own right. He's worked with Al Stewart on a regular basis as well as many others at hundreds of venues as far ranging as The Bottom Line, the Glastonbury Festival and the Edmonton Folk Festival. In addition to his prodigious musical accomplishments, he also holds a doctorate in Philosophy.

Founded in May 1985, The Folk Club of Reston-Herndon (formerly called The Reston Folk Club) came about through collaboration between Rose Haskell and Bev Osburn, who are still club members. Rose and John Haskell were in England when Bev and Jack Osburn visited them, got to experience the British folk club tradition, and fell in love with the concept. Upon returning to the States, Rose and Bev decided to start something similar here. The original home of the Folk Club was a restaurant in the Tall Oaks Center in Reston – the Acorn. Later short-term homes were The Red Caboose restaurant and then the Jonathan's Keep community center, all in Reston.

After three homes in 2 1/3 years, a new one was found at the Tortilla Factory in Herndon, and thanks to the generous support of owners Chuck Curcio and Ron Fox, that lasted for almost 25 years. When the Tortilla Factory closed in February 2012 we moved to The Amphora Diner Deluxe (after a few weeks in Joe's Pizza in Sterling), which has been an excellent fit.

In all these 31 years the Folk Club has met weekly for open mic and concert performances hosting over 310 concerts and countless open mic performers. We are proud to be an allvolunteer organization and welcome the folks who come to perform, listen, and enjoy what has become a tradition in the Northern Virginia and greater Washington area. We look forward to many more years to come, and a long stay in our current home at the Amphora Diner Deluxe.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
