June 7 Showcase – Dave Law & Reston Station

Dave Law is currently the Project Safety and Security Manager for the Airports Authority for the construction of Phase II of the Silver Line Metro. extending from Wiehle Avenue Station out to Dulles Airport and beyond to Ashburn, VA. Dave and his bride of 27 years, Kate, are now building their (partial) retirement home on Deep Lake in Garrett Creek County, located in western Maryland, and they also plan to keep a home here in Reston

As the founding member of the original folk rock group "Reston Station," Dave has performed with many club

members in search of a lasting folk trio with the same name. That also happens to be the name of the future Metro station near Reston Town Center that is the first of six new train stations in Phase II.

The lineup of Reston Station for this showcase will include a new Folk Club member, Norman Dovberg, who will be providing lead vocals and guitar, and is now an official member of Reston Station. Norman had his roots in the "Folk Craze" of the 60s and also has performed with both rock and blues bands over the decades. For the past few years, Norman has performed solo, and enjoys a variety of music styles and traditions. Recently relocated from upstate New York, he suddenly has found himself immersed in this musical project called "Reston Station."

Also joining us is the lovely and seriously talented Cindy McConnell, who has agreed to take a short break from her horseback riding, greyhound rescuing, and playing great music at local wineries/similar to join us for this project. Cindy has been performing music in the Northern Virginia — and also in the South Central Pennsylvania and New York Finger Lakes regions — for about 15 years, mostly solo, and also with South of Sane (2006-2008).

Our genre will include covers by Peter, Paul & Mary, Neil Young, Eagles, Gordon Lightfoot, Tom Paxton, John Prine, and the Grateful Dead.

Tooooooot Toot! Next stop ... Reston Station ... where, unlike Metro, there's hot food, cold beverages and where you're also encouraged to sing along.

Cosy Sheridan first caught the attention of national folk audiences in 1992 when she won the New Folk Songwriting Contest at The Kerrville Folk Festival, the Troubadour Award at The Telluride Bluegrass Festival and then released her critically acclaimed CD, Quietly Led, on Waterbug Records. The Boston Globe wrote, "She is now being called one of the best new singer/songwriters." Her 2014 release, Pretty Bird, was chosen as one of Sing Out Magazine's "Great CDs of 2014."

In her new CD, Sometimes I Feel Too Much, Cosy weaves deeply felt experiences from her own life into finely crafted musical tapestries - connecting the personal to the universal, and inviting us to a deeper experience of our own life. The first song, Eurydice Goodnight, is a goodbye to her home in the American southwest and parallels the story of Orpheus' and his lost wife by saying goodbye to a beloved landscape. Many of the songs were co-written with her husband and bass player, Charlie Koch who will be joining Cosy on stage at the Folk Club.

Sheridan's concerts are wide-ranging explorations -love songs for adults and practical philosophy for a complicated world. Her topics are as varied as the stock market crash of 2008 and the fall-out from uranium mining in the American Southwest. She has re-written greek myths -- Persephone runs away with Hades the biker. She is also known for her signature parodies on aging and women. Her lyrical dexterity is backed by her distinctive percussive guitar style.

For the past 20 years Cosy has taught classes in songwriting, performance and guitar at workshops and adult music camps across the country. In 2008 she co-founded the Moab Folk Camp in Moab, Utah.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
