

## August 9 Showcase – Silver Strings, MD by Richard Weil



"Silver Strings, MD" is a Chesapeake Bay area folk, bluegrass, blues, traditional, and contemporary music string band. Between the five bandmates, all born along the East Coast, they grew up cutting their teeth in folk, jug band, barbershop quartet, rock, bluegrass, country, and folk music ensembles. Formed about three years ago, the group has been invited to play at the Washington Folk Festival, St. Alban's School, the Takoma Park Folk Festival, the Takoma Park VFW, and house concerts.

Paul Loether (guitar, bass, banjo, and vocals) met Richard Weil (guitar, percussion, and vocals) in high school over 45 years ago. Tom Carroll (guitar, vocals, and "Silver Strings, MD" "voice"), Blount Stewart (harmonica and vocals), and Pepper Watkins (guitar, bass, banjo, and vocals) met Paul and Richard several years ago and completed the round of band mates.


"Together Again," a CD of originals and covers, features four of the Strings and was recorded several years ago. The band is making another record due out later this year, tentatively titled "Silver Strings, MD - The Basement Tapes." The band has a Facebook page where you can hear them perform "Sea of Heartbreak," which garnered over 11,000 internet views. In addition, the band typically donates proceeds from its performances to "Shepherd's Table," a local non-profit organization based in Silver Spring, MD, which feeds the homeless 365 days a year.

"Silver Strings, MD" presents a mix of original music and covers which they make their own. Each musician brings truth and enthusiasm to the music being sung or played, and audiences are appreciative of the diverse styles of music offered. It may be a solo, duet, group, or sing-along that weaves the tapestry of this band and warms the hearts of its audiences. "Silver Strings, MD" continues to grow in its song repertoire and energy with the goal of continuing to share the joy of music. The band looks forward to its Showcase performance at the Folk Club!



# Songwriter's Night August 16, 2016

When composer Giuseppe Verdi was asked where he got the inspiration to write so many operas he replied, "I worked at it." In that vein, some musicians sometimes get a creative spark, and are driven to "work at it" until they have written a song that satisfies them. Then they usually seek to share it with others by performing it and find out how others respond.



We appreciate the creativity and craft that makes all of this happen, so on August 16<sup>th</sup> we are having a Songwriter's Night and hoping that songwriters in the area will come forward to share their songs with the audience at The Folk Club. We envision a night when songwriters perform their original songs. In the spirit of inclusion, non-songwriters can play songs written by Folk Club members. Any combination of originality would work: a song with original words and music, an old song with new verses created (a parody, for example), a song made by adding music to existing lyrics (a poem, maybe), or an instrumental song that someone has written.

However, this doesn't mean it's required for all songs to be originals, but it really would be nice if that is the case. Often we hear many (or all) cover songs on a typical night at The Folk Club, some of which we've heard umpteen times. So let's swing the pendulum in the other direction for once! Sure, it's fun to hear and sing along with songs we know, but shouldn't we also encourage creativity? This is a chance to show our support and appreciation to those brave souls who are able to bring something new and different into the world.



Note: This is the second Folk Club theme night. The Early Rock 'n' Roll Night in July was a huge success, so we are doing the same this month since there is no concert scheduled. As was done in July, we will try our best to allow everyone to play and we hope that the performers can be flexible. If you only plan to play one or two songs please let us know. ## **Rain Follows the Plow: A Dust Opera**

Rain Follows the Plow is a unique, collaborative musical project based on an album-length song cycle about the Dust Bowl, written by Oklahoma native Steve Coffee. It showcases the Americana movement at its best, celebrating authentic folk traditions with freshness and creativity. Throughout 2016, Rain Follows the Plow is being staged as a "folk opera."

In July there were five performances for the 2016 Capital Fringe on Fri 7/8, Sun 7/10, Sat 7/16, Thu 7/21, and Sat 7/23. It was also extended to additional performances due to its appreciative audiences.

#### SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
