January 10 Showcase – Nancy Truax

I live in Reston, Virginia with my husband Wayne and our Beagle/Jack Russell mix Joey. Joey likes to listen to me practice, and occasionally sings along.

I grew up in East Tennessee, living at various times in Chattanooga, Knoxville, and Maryville. Outside of our house there was a lot of mountain-flavored music; inside there was a lot of opera and Jethro Tull. I got my first guitar when I was 11 (a much-abused Stella that had a crack down the front), but I didn't know how to play it and my family didn't have money for lessons. So, I had to teach myself. I managed to find a Mel Bay chord book and learned to play a few basic chords, and sat around with friends teaching each other things we had learned. I didn't (and still don't) know much about music theory, but I sure liked to sing.

I think I got my love of singing from my Dad. He had a beautiful tenor voice and loved to sing opera and Irish laments. And he encouraged me to sing. He taught me that singing a song well is about so much more than just hitting the notes. He told me that it's almost like acting – you have to become the person that the song is about.

It's not always easy, but I think I'm at my best when I can leave myself behind and be the person in the song.

Much as I loved to sing, though, it wasn't anything I had ever done in front of an audience. I only ever sang at home by myself, or in the car, or sitting around the campfire with friends. 10 years ago or so, I got together with my neighbor (and long-time Folk Club regular) Greg Vickers for some impromptu playing and singing. "This was fun," we said, "we should do it again some time." A few years went by before we ever did. Then in 2009 Greg invited me to come to the Folk Club to do a few songs with him for his showcase. That was the first time I had ever performed in public. Greg and I continued to play together, and we were soon joined by Matt Larson and formed the West Market Trio, playing in various places around the Northern Virginia/DC area.

Regrettably (for me, anyway), Matt took a job down in Panama and Greg moved to DC. I had not been singing as much as I used to, but I really missed it. I started coming back to the Folk Club, and I've been playing at a few new places (new for me, anyway), including Cristina's Café in Strasburg and Jirani Coffee House in Manassas.

My plan for 2017 is to learn new songs and perhaps start writing some of my own.

Joan & Joni is a tribute to Joan Baez and Joni Mitchell performed by singer-songwriters Allison Shapira and Kipyn Martin. Kipyn Martin is an award-winning Americana singer-songwriter whose roots sink deep into the banks of the Shenandoah River. Allison Shapira is a recovering opera singer who recently found her authentic voice as a folksinger and songwriter.

In Joan & Joni, Allison and Kipyn bring to the stage many of Joan Baez and Joni Mitchell's well-known songs, as well as a few of their lesser-known gems, and demonstrate the effect Joan and Joni have had on their own development as modern musicians. Allison and Kipyn met at the Northeast Regional Folk Alliance (NERFA) conference in November 2013. Both classically trained singers and up-and-coming musicians on the DC-area folk scene, they soon realized their musical influences were similarly shaped by the folk revival music of the 60's.

Allison Shapira spent years studying classical voice at Boston University, Tanglewood, and in Italy but at home she listened to the folk revival music of Joan TUESDAY, JANUARY 17, 2017

Baez, Bob Dylan, and Judy Collins. In 2011, alongside a career in diplomacy, communications, and international relations, Allison picked up a guitar for the first time and started writing her own music. Her debut CD, *Coming Home* was recorded in 2012 and released at the very same Club Passim (then Club 47) where Joan Baez got her start in 1958.

Kipyn Martin is a West Virginia native who now resides in the Washington DC area. Recent accolades include being named New Artist of the Year by the Washington Area Music Association in 2015 and winning Gold and Silver Awards in the 2014 Mid-Atlantic Song Contest. Her song "Nightbird" from her debut album, *Undercover Muse* won a Gold Award, as well as the Director's Choice Award, in the 2013 Mid-Atlantic Song Contest and she received international distinction in the 2013 UK Song Contest when "I Believe in You" from *Undercover Muse* earned a semi-finalist rating.

Allison and Kipyn's first on-stage appearance as *Joan & Joni* was at the FCRH Open Mic in December 2014.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
