### July 11 Showcase – Nancy Truax

I grew up in East Tennessee, living at various times in Chattanooga, Knoxville, and Maryville. I joined the Coast Guard at the age of 21, and enjoyed a long and varied career, stationed in places like Hawaii, Alaska, California, and DC. I started out at Base Honolulu in charge of my very own Coast Guard Cutter (it had a 4 horse power Briggs and Stratton engine with a 22" blade). I worked for many years as a Morse Code and voice radio operator, mostly working search and rescue communications with the commercial fishing fleet. I was fortunate enough to be selected for the Coast Guard's Funded Legal Education Program, and spent the last ten years of my career in the JAG program. I ended my Coast Guard career as a criminal defense attorney, representing Coast Guard members whose court-martial convictions were up on appeal, and I continue to do that in retirement, although now the clients are from all branches of the military. So I feel right at home at the Folk Club – the red light means stop, just like it does in the appellate court.

I first came to the Folk Club ten or so years ago when I was invited by my neighbor Greg Vickers to join him on a few songs in his showcase. That was the first time I had ever sung into a microphone. There were a few



open slots at the end that night. I wasn't planning on doing anything solo, but I borrowed a guitar and sang a few more songs. It was terrifying, but also the most rewarding experience, and I was hooked! Greg and I continued to sing together, and we were soon joined by Matt Larson and formed the West Market Trio. We played and sang at a bunch of places around DC and Northern Virginia, but we had to disband when Matt left us to be the Director of the Smithsonian Institute for Tropical Research in Panama. As much as I miss the West Market Trio, I think Matt made the right choice.

I guess this is the part where I'm supposed to talk about my musical influences. My biggest influences were not singers or songwriters, but my Dad and my sister. My Dad never played any instrument but had the most beautiful voice. He'd ask me to learn songs for us to sing together. My sister Jean was five years older than me. Back in the days when music was not portable, when listening to music was a purposeful act, and when other girls her age were buying clothes and make-up, Jean spent all of her money on records. Jean loved all kinds of music, and I was along for that fabulous ride. I learned from my Dad to keep working on a song until you get it right. I learned from Jean that there is an endless variety of music out there, and it's all good. Many of my favorite songs today are songs from that early period of my life.

My plan for 2017 is to try not to get too distracted by my other hobby, which is sewing bags and purses.



### British Invasion Night July 18, 2017 by Ben the President



On February 9, 1964 73 million television viewers heard Ed Sullivan proclaim "Ladies and Gentlemen, the Beatles", they started playing "All My Loving", and the hysterical screaming began. That event was a watershed moment in music and popular culture, and the defining moment in the British Invasion of American popular music. For the next two years or so, the only sound that mattered on the American hit parade had a British accent. Life magazine put it like this: "In 1776 England lost her American colonies. Last week the Beatles took them back."

In the front ranks, marching in formation behind the Beatles, were the Dave Clark Five, Herman's Hermits, the Searchers, the Hollies, the Animals, the Kinks, the Yardbirds, Gerry and the Pacemakers, Freddie

and the Dreamers, Petula Clark, Dusty Springfield, Peter and Gordon, Chad and Jeremy, and of course the bad-boy Rolling Stones. They were followed by the Yardbirds, the Who, Manfred Mann, the Zombies, Them, Marianne Faithful, Donovan, the Spencer Davis Group, the Moody Blues, and many more.

On July 18<sup>th</sup> we encourage you to come and perform, listen to, and sing out music from the British Invasion, and any later British music (there was a second wave in the 80's, led by the Police, the Eurythmics, Culture Club, Duran Duran, David Bowie, and Human League). Anyone doing the "Freddy" gets extra points.

The Folk Club does not have concerts in July and August, and a few members came up with the idea of substituting theme nights. Our first theme nights in July and August 2016 were a hit, so we're continuing the idea this year. It's an opportunity to try something a little different and have fun with it. So on this

night in July, when there would normally be a concert, we're encouraging performers to present songs that fit the theme. Of course, that doesn't mean it's required, but musicians who perform songs in line with the theme will be appreciated.

Note: If there are more than ten performers on this night, we may extend the evening a bit or change the length of each slot, to allow every musician to play.

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
