# July 10 Showcase – Jim Nagle by Jim



Okay, showcase time again. Not sure how much has really changed since my last one. I guess the one big thing is that I am now retired following 27 mostly very good years of federal service with the NIH. So, one of the things I thought would happen was I that I would spend a lot more time playing music. Nearly 5 months later, I'd have to confess that that has only been partly true. Getting distracted seems easier every day.

Writing this blurb was another thing I got distracted from doing and now I'm up against a deadline. I've probably talked about this before but this process for me has to start with a set of decisions about songs to play combined with recruiting collaborators. I've generally used Showcases as opportunities to play songs that members have not heard me play before. It's more work and riskier but I feel is ultimately worth it. Who wants to simply re-hear songs we have previously performed? I'm pleased and grateful for the willingness of 'my band' to allow me to put this pressure on them. There will be a couple of songs which I've been trying to add for a while but it was cool when I pulled something else out which I though was a bit more off the beaten path and got a very positive response from the band. No spoilers. You have to show up. Only clue I'll give is that my interest in and love of slide playing was solidified when I discovered and began to explore the music of Duane Allman back in HS. It was only after starting down that road that I learned there was this whole other thing called lap style playing. Still took me decades longer to take the plunge and try it for myself.

I've still a few loose ends to tie together but I'm hoping to deliver a showcase that folks will enjoy and if we truly succeed, remember fondly. Big thanks to the Stewart Sisters for their love and support now

going back 5 years or more. Playing with you has been a huge growth opportunity for me. Thank you.

One final non-music or group related note, I've been running like crazy the last few months in preparation for yet another attempt on the 100-mile footrace in VT that I have previously finished four times (and failed to finish 3 other times). It's been the one thing that I have been able to focus on well. Eleven days after the showcase, July 21<sup>st</sup>, I'll be running from before sun up to after sun down. In the notable words of Tim O'Brien and Darrell Scott, "put one foot in front of the other, steppin' into the here and now, I'm not sure just where I'm goin', but I will get there anyhow."

Performers, pick out three songs from your favorite female songwriters (they can be songs co-written with men as well), and join us on July 17! Listeners, come and enjoy the songs they've picked to share. It's a safe bet that some will be familiar favorites and others will be enjoyable discoveries.



The Folk Club does not have concerts in July and August, so some members came up with the idea of substituting theme nights. Previous theme nights in 2016 and 2017 have been well-received, so we're continuing the idea. It's an opportunity to try something a little different and have fun with it. So we're encouraging performers to present only songs that fit the theme. Of course, that doesn't mean it's required, but if musicians are able to do that it will be appreciated.

Note: If there are more than ten performers on this night, we may extend the evening a bit or change the length of each slot, in an attempt to allow every musician to play.

### SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
