While Don Stallone (that's Sta-loan-eh, rhymes with balonay) would never say he is famous, he is, in fact, well-known along the mid-Atlantic (occasionally this is a "good thing.") He sings music mainly from the British Isles, such as ballads, street songs, sea songs, sci-fi filk — with the occasional musical oddity thrown in (like a Maori haka).

Don was a founding member of the quintet Clam Chowder and the trio Ironweed, and was the resident tenor in The Ship's Company chantymen. He counts among his major influences the late, great Pete Seeger, Frank "the Voice of Dublin" Harte, Nana Mouskouri, "Weird Al" Yankovich, Planxty, and Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (Johnny to his friends).

Don has performed lots of places, but the Reston Folk Club made him (in

particular) and Clam Chowder (in general) welcome a very long time ago, and for that reason¹ he is looking forward to an a cappella session behind the mic.

For this performance he promises to "keep it clean."

Hubby Jenkins is a talented multi-instrumentalist who endeavors to share his love and knowledge of old-time American music. Born and raised in Brooklyn he delved into his Southern roots, following the thread of African American history that wove itself through country blues, ragtime, fiddle and banjo, and traditional jazz. Hubby got his higher musical education started as a busker. He developed his guitar and vocal craft on the sidewalks and subway platforms of New York City, performing material by those venerable artists whose work he was quickly absorbing. An ambitiously itinerant musician, he took his show on the road, playing the streets, coffee shops, bars, and house parties of cities around the U.S.

After years of busking around the country and making a name for himself, Hubby became acquainted with the Carolina Chocolate Drops. Since 2010 he has been an integral part of the Grammy award winning Carolina Chocolate Drops and continues to make solo performances.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

On the 2nd Tuesday of the month (usually), we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance. To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
