August 8 Showcase – Larry Mediate with Ray Kaminsky

Larry Mediate joined the Folk Club back about 1986, when it met at Jonathan's Keep in Reston. He'd heard about it from Mark Elliott and Marty Ottobre, two even earlier club members. Larry's probably the first of what are now quite a few club marriages - he met his wife Beverly at one of those early sessions. Larry was club President for six years in the early 90's, and owned a music store back then, too. His tenor voice was a fixture at our gatherings during those early years.

A new career in telecom demanded more time, though, and Larry became less active. He worked at UUNet, which changed into Worldcom, then MCI, and now Verizon, where he manages internet technical support. We hope Verizon internet connections don't suffer, but we're more than happy to see Larry back with us regularly on Tuesdays!

For the showcase, Larry will do an original, about the Madrid bombings, and other songs that he says may surprise us. Accompanying him will be his successor as club President, Ray Kaminsky. Ray also does the booking for the club, is the founder of the Herndon Blues Festival, and has several recordings out, one of which won a 2001 Wammie award as best blues recording.

Larry's songs frequently have a Southwestern flavor to them, while Ray usually mines the Delta/Chicago vein, so perhaps the two together will create a new genre – let's call it Blue Adobe. Come to think of it, that wouldn't be so shabby as a band name, either!

The Susan Greenbaum Band recently won a national competition to be the opening act for international superstar Jewel. Susan's band was selected by industry professionals and over 100,000 internet voters. As Jewel played solo, Susan also performed solo and enjoyed overwhelming success for the duration of the ten-show tour across the Northeast, selling almost 1,000 CDs and welcoming thousands of new fans. Susan released her third independent CD, "Hey, Hey, Hey!" in September '02 to rave reviews. The disc is a 13-song collection of intelligent lyrics, beautiful melodies, catchy hooks and always Susan's mellifluous and versatile voice. Within every song and performance are the artist's sincerity and boundless energy.

Billboard Magazine has reviewed two songs from "Hey, Hey, Hey!" in the "Singles" column. "Spin Like a Top" has "hooks that drill into your brain; smart, organic production; and lyrical substance to make the music an interactive experience." "Everything but You" received a

glowing review in Billboard when released as a single in 2000, and it was also added to commercial radio station WMXB-103.7 FM. The Richmond Times-Dispatch called "Hey, Hey, Hey!" the best local release of 2002. During MP3.com's heyday, Susan Greenbaum was one of the site's most popular artists, famous or unknown. She held impressive positions on several charts and garnered over 180,000 downloads of her songs, which were frequently #1 or in the Top Ten of the Acoustic Rock and Pop Susan draws big, enthusiastic audiences who delight in her lively, diverse and powerful charts. performances. Thanks to the internet, she has fans on every continent. She performs solo and with her band and has appeared at such venues as The Bottom Line in NYC, The Birchmere, and Rams Head Tavern. In addition to touring with Jewel, Susan's credits include performing an acoustic set with Dave Matthews Band violinist Boyd Tinsley; sharing bills with Jill Sobule; and opening for Kenny Loggins, Patty Griffin, Dar Williams, Janis Ian, Todd Snider, Tuck and Patti, Iris DeMent, Lucy Kaplansky, Lloyd Cole and Catie Curtis. Susan also endorses W.L Gore's Elixir Strings. The most frequently heard comment at her gigs is, "Great songs--and how does all that big, beautiful sound come out of someone under five feet tall?"

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
