This song takes a while, so Greg is glad to have the extra time available with the showcase format. Greg hopes to perform a few songs with his frequent music partner, **Michelle Murray**. And two guys who haven't played the folk club before: **Les Hatley** (lead guitar) and **Doug Brouder** (bass, mandolin and vocals). And he'll probably get some assistance from house percussionist, **Ron Goad**, if he can get Ron to promise to behave himself.

Guthrie's son Abe Guthrie with his band Xavier and daughter Sarah Lee Guthrie and Johnny Irion will hold seven concerts along the route. Friends stepping aboard the southbound odyssey along the way will include Guy Davis, Ramsay Midwood, Kevn Kinney and Drivin' n' Cryin', John Flynn, Gordon Titcomb, and The Burns Sisters.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!
