December 12 Showcase – Scott Malyszka by Dan Grove

Scott Malyszka (pronounced Ma-lis-ka) lives in Reston near Trader Joe's, with his wife Robin and three big dogs. He's originally from Pennsylvania, where he grew up in a house full of music. The radio or stereo was always on, and he particularly remembers his parents' Elvis and Beatles records. Scott played flute and saxophone in the school band, then got a guitar at age 14 and was soon into a Bob Dylan phase. Over the years he's also listened to Woody Guthrie, Hank Williams, Pete Seeger, blues artists, Bill Monroe, Doc Watson, and many others.

Scott's first college career was in Biblical and ancient Near East studies. He has a BA and an MA in Theology, and has done research in the Akkadian, Aramaic, Greek, and Hebrew languages. He then got a BA in Information Systems at Penn State, became a software engineer, and currently works for the College Board in Reston Town Center. He codes in C, C++, HTML, Oracle SQL, and Java.

That's a lot of languages, ranging from ancient to cutting edge modern. But Scott also knows another notation system – braille. Yes, Scott is blind. You may have seen him at the Folk Club as a duo with **Harry Brooks**, a friend Scott met while working at Network Solutions a while ago. Harry will be there again on guitar for the showcase, and they'll be joined by **Bill Smoot** on mandolin and bass, and **Kathleen Farrar** on banjo. Scott will play fiddle and guitar, and handle the lead vocals on some bluegrass and old-time songs.

Scott's introduction to bluegrass music was in an unusual place – he was doing graduate studies in Jerusalem in 1993, and some neighbors asked him to form a trio. He didn't really know what bluegrass was then, but certainly picked it up, and his strong voice is perfect for it. Don't miss this showcase!

Most Tuesday nights the Folk Club is an open-mike format with a signup board. Each performer has 12 minutes, which includes setup time. On the 2^{nd} Tuesday of the month, we feature a "Showcase" of a Folk Club member in a 25-minute performance.

SHOWCASE PERFORMANCES

To be in the Showcase you must: 1) be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in the last 6 months; 2) fill out a lottery slip and place it in the "drawing bucket"; 3) Win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase; and 4) be prepared to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified ads, articles, reviews, artwork and other music-related items to Bob Hampton at <u>bhampton@ossva.com</u>. Information should be received 1 week prior to the end of the month for the next month's newsletter. Items will be published on the basis of music-related interest, timeliness, and available space.
