



Cindy adds ballads from Scotland and Appalachia while accompanying her lovely voice with guitar, banjo and English concertina. Steve, an accomplished guitarist with a rich, full, deep voice sings his original works with outstanding skill. Together they make an evening pass far too fast for an audience captured by their grace and style.

Both artist have numerous recordings to their credit and have extensive play list across North America at festivals, clubs and colleges, performing live and on the air.
