The 47th Annual Edinburgh Festival Fringe -- a Music Junkie's Review (Susan McSwain)

The largest-ever Edinburgh Festival Fringe took place this year from Aug 16-Sep 5, and one RHFC member was there to experience it. Since I assume there are other music junkies in the club who would like to attend this worldfamous festival, I will tell you a bit about what to expect.

The "Fringe Programme" is a necessary guide for the festivities and can be purchased ahead of time by mail for \$5.00 (credit card) from the Fringe Box Office, or you can pick up a copy when you arrive in Edinburgh. This year's Programme was 120 pages long, with activities listed under 20 headings. My primary interest was folk music so I only went to one play, but there were enough activities in every category, from comedies, to jazz, to dance to keep everyone busy. I was able to attend the entire three weeks of the festival, but even if you are only there for a few days, you can easily go to three or more events a day.

There are over 150 festival venues scattered in and around Edinburgh, all accessible by bus. However, many bus lines stop running after midnight, so if you do not want to pay taxi fare, as was my case, you must be prepared to walk home from the late programs in the "wee" hours of the morning, often in the rain. Edinburgh is a very safe city to be out in late at night - too bad the same can't be said for our large American cities! Many pubs are open well past midnight, and a stop in one can be a nice way to end an evening's outing.

A three week stay in Edinburgh was possible for me because I stayed with friends who live there, the family of my ex-singing partner from South Africa. Since I was back with my long-time singing partner, we were able to do a bit of our own music as well as attend concerts. There are several year-round acoustic venues in town, and at least four folk clubs. Blackfriars Music Shop has up-to-date info on all of them. Open mike nights tend to be only once a month, with one club requiring advance arrangements for even the open night.

Most of the concerts I attended were by U.K. artists -

North Sea Gas, Savourna Stevenson, Avalon, The Poozies, Bert Jansch, The McCalmans, Cauld Blast Orchestra, Clan Alba, the military tattoo and fireworks at the Castle, Dreona, Findask, Capercaillie, Boys of the Lough, Ralph McTell, Kathryn Fickell Band, Hamish Moore and the Dick Lee Quartet, Mike Oldfield and Tony Cuffe. The international concerts I went to included Makvirag (outstanding traditional Hungarian folk group), Outback (a new age type Australian group), Judy Small (Australian singersongwriter), and Apu (lively Andean music from Peru).

All of Edinburgh is in a festive mood during the Fringe. Every local man who owns a kilt wears it, there are bagpipe players everywhere, and a variety of buskers can be found on street corners. The beer and ale is the best in the world, and I liked the atmosphere in the folk clubs and pubs. If you ever get a chance to attend the Fringe, don't hesitate - go! As folk club audiences in Edinburgh would say, "More! More!"

Scott Ainslie is one of the most exciting blues performers working today. He's performed in Europe and off-Broadway. He has recordings available on Rounder Records and Heritage Records, is a highly respected author on the subject of the blues, and has toured overseas under the auspices of the U.S. Information Service and the British Arts Council. In addition to appearances with David Bromberg, John Hammond, and John Lee Hooker (to name a few), Scott has done extensive field work with less wellknown traditional blues performers. He has produced and directed Piedmont Blues Today, an educational videotape on traditional blues, with grant support from the Folklife Section of the North Carolina Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts.



As a member of North Carolina's prestigious Visiting Artist Program, Scott has presented programs on blues and Black music history to thousands of school children. His extensive repertoire and talent make him a gifted and much-sought-after presenter at guitar workshops and folklife symposiums. Mr. Ainslie seldom tours in the Washington area so don't pass up this opportunity to see him at The Folk Club in the Back Room of The Tortilla Factory Restaurant.
