

On October 10, starting at noon in the center of Herndon will be the Herndon Festival sponsored by the Herndon Arts Council (among others). Folk Club members are participating in this event and the Folk Club is providing its support through use of our sound system.

Ellen Kaminsky has been serving as a consultant and coordinator for the festival, and informs your editor that the festival has a wide range of activities involving folklore, folk singing and craftsmanship which will be of interest to our members.

The main stage of the festival will feature music all afternoon, beginning at noon with Ray Kaminsky, followed at 2PM by Magpie and then at 4PM with Dramtreeo.

Other activities include a children's stage which will be emcee'd by Bill Davis who will also provide wandering minstrel songs for kids and will also feature the Battersby Duo.

Craftsmanship and cultural history will be well represented by Ralph Lee Smith and his daughter Koyuki who will be giving Dulcimer talks and demonstrations all afternoon and by Lea Coryell and Mary Briggs who will be giving banjo and fiddle demonstrations in the old-time style.

For an enjoyable afternoon - come to the Festival.


Bob Franke

Singer-songwriter Bob Franke began his folk music career in 1965 while still a student at the University of Michigan, but has made his home in New England since 1969. In the tradition of all folksingers, he has made a career of performing in coffee-houses, colleges, festivals, bars, streets, homes and churches throughout the U.S. and Canada.

While his performance credentials are many, his abilities as a singer-musician and a songwriter are what we will all be out to enjoy this evening. He has a half-dozen albums under his belt and his songs have been recorded by such notables as Garnet Rogers, Tony Rice, John McCutcheon and Bright Morning Star.



Winner of numerous music awards in his Boston home area and in San Francisco, Bob has made quite a hit leading workshops in songwriting and guitar at Kerrville, the Philadelphia Folk Festival, and other locations. He has also been guest lecturer and workshop leader/participant on the Blues at Philadelphia, Winnepeg and Boston University.
