Herndon Kicks Off Second Annual Folk Festival


The second annual Herndon Folk Festival will be held from noon to 5pm on Sunday October 9, 1994 around the Town Hall in Historic Herndon. The event features folk music on two stages, children's entertainment, games and contests, traditional dance, musical instrument workshops, and demonstrations. Admission is free.

Last year's event maintained the comfortable, small town atmosphere reminiscent of an old fashion country fair, even with several thousand in attendance. This year's festival promises to be every bit as popular. Performers on the main stage include folk legend Garnett Rogers and a cappella Gospel music by the Smithsonian Folk Life

festival veteran group Reverb. Kicking off the main stage entertainment will be Mid-Atlantic Songwriter award winner Susan Graham White, featuring songs from her newest release. Mary Cliff, of WETA's Saturday folk music show *Traditions*, will host the main stage.

The festival is presented by Herndon Parks and Recreation, in association with the Folk Club of Reston-Herndon and the Council For the Arts of Herndon.
