July Showcase - Andrew McKnight



Andrew McKnight started "noodling" on a guitar when he was twelve years old. A year or so later, he spent a whole summer weeding strawberry fields near his home in northeastern Connecticut so that he could buy an electric guitar, a Fender Stratocaster. One of the first songs he learned was *Johnny B. Goode*, and for a long time his passion was playing lead guitar in a band. Hearing Shawn Colvin and John Gorka several years ago, however, inspired him to try being a solo singer/songwriter, and "the rest has been a continuously chaotic snowball downhill."

Andrew first started playing open mikes and coffeehouses in 1993, then participated in the Mid-Atlantic Coalition of Folk Music Presenters new talent showcase in the fall of 1994. Early support from people like Mary Cliff, Eileen Joyner, Doris Justice, and Sue Trainor was very encouraging. The release of his CD *Traveler* and extensive touring since then would have kept most people busy, but Andrew's also a part-time venue operator (the Shenandoah Coffeehouses in Reston and Shepherdstown), booking agent (the Cascades Starbuck's series), and festival host (the annual Mountville Folk Festival). Oh, and an environmental engineer. That's right, he has a day job, too, at CH2M Hill in Herndon.

Highlights of this year include playing at scores of venues in the Mid-Atlantic region, plus a month-long tour to Texas and back, playing almost every night at places like Eddie's Attic in Decatur, Georgia, Neutral Ground in New Orleans (with Ellis Paul), Anderson Fair in Houston, and the Waterloo Ice House in Austin. At the Kerrville Folk Festival Andrew visited all the fringe campfires, and felt right at home, he says, at Camp Stupid. Upcoming are two days playing at the Olympic Village Coffeehouse in Atlanta, a return engagement at the Bluebird Cafe in Nashville, and a tour of the northeast.

Andrew started the Shenandoah Coffeehouse series to bring the area's artists together with their community. He frequently knows the other performers' songs, and can add harmonies and instrumental back-

frequently knows the other performers' songs, and can add harmonies and instrumental backups. His enthusiasm is contagious, and he says he's in some ways a "poor folkie because I'm
not terribly tortured." He's happily married and well adjusted, and you can hear it in his
songs. Andrew's music has been described by the Folk and Acoustic Music Exchange as "a
journey around the rim of a wheel: a touch of traditional, a touch of country, a touch of Celtic,
a touch of contemporary. Spokes run down from each to a sweet spot at the hub. In that
sweet spot, McKnight combines them all to spin his magic into a new art form - a kind of
'Blues-grass.' *Traveler* is an album of uncommonly fine love songs. In addition to all varieties of romantic love, there is McKnight's incredible joy and love for his music. You will find
an overflowing love for life (in all its forms), as well as a great love for the land and people of
the American countryside."



Bill Staines is renowned as one of America's finest singer-songwriters, as evidenced by the number of artists around the world who cover and win recognition with his songs. The Roseville Fair topped this area's MusicAmericana survey with Liam Clancy and Tommy Makem's offering, with the second vote going to Nancy Griffith's version. Faith of Man, covered by Priscilla Herdman, stayed on the WFMA survey chart for years. Mason Williams, Grampa Jones, Jerry Jeff Walker, the Mill Run Dulcimer Band, Magpie, the Mighty Possums, Hickory Grove, George Turman, and

Side by Side are a sampling of national and regional artists performing and recording Bill's songs. But the best performer of Bill's music is Bill himself. He's been touring for over 20 years, sometimes prolifically - in 1990, for example, he performed over 200 concert dates.

Bill weaves a magical blend of wit and gentle humor into his shows. As one reviewer wrote, "he has a sense of timing to match the best stand-up comic. His music is a slice of Americana, reflecting with the same ease his feelings about the prairie people of the Midwest or the adventurers of the Yukon."

Bill was voted Boston's best performer by the *Phoenix* and favorite performer by the *Boston Globe's* annual Reader's Poll. Radio and television performances have included *A Prairie Home Companion, Mountain Stage*, and a host of local programs on PBS and network TV. Anyone not familiar with the music of Bill Staines is in for a special treat, but come early - his shows have sold out in every one of his three prior engagements at the Folk Club!

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice!
