

# November 12 Showcase - Dan Grove

Most Folk Club members have a passion for music that started at an early age. This month's Showcase performer, Dan Grove, is no exception. He loved music so much that he used to sneak listening to the radio at night when he was young. A native Washingtonian, Dan was raised in Arlington and, although he left for a while to experience college and Life, he returned to the area after eight years and this has been home base ever since.

His "formal" musical training kicked off with a year of piano lessons during third grade, followed by four years of flute and six months of banjo lessons. When he couldn't find anyone who actually wanted to listen to him play banjo, Dan smartened up and taught himself guitar. At Arlington's Wakefield High School he became lead guitarist and manager for *The Pendletons*, a rock & soul group for which he also played flute, bass, and tenor sax. Sadly, the group disbanded after high school and Dan gave up music for a long time.

About four and a half years ago he realized how much he missed music. Deciding to buy a new guitar, he asked Ray Kaminsky's advice, and wound up ordering a Taylor through Folk Club Prez Larry Mediate, who had a music store at the time. Small world! Dan loves the guitar.

I asked Dan what his most important musical experience was, and he replied without hesitation, "Seeing Hendrix play at the old Ambassador Theater downtown, twice during a week-long gig in 1967." Other musical influences have been Motown, Bonnie Raitt, Mark Hanson, several Piedmont blues artists, and Al Petteway.

As far as nonmusical experiences, Dan's chosen some interesting paths. At the age of 20, he went to London, bought a motorcycle, and toured around Europe until he reached Morocco "because I was looking for the least responsible thing I could do at the time." More recently, he's been volunteering for ecological research, which has taken him to great places like the Belize barrier reef and a dolphin language research project in Hawaii. For the last nine years he's

been doing triathlons, and he's recently taken up horseback riding. Of special interest to FC members, Dan has been working on a Smithsonian electric guitar project that, coincidentally, will culminate in concerts, displays, and a symposium during the week of his showcase.

Dan likes the Folk Club because it provides a supportive environment for beginners to get some experience, and it's a great place for established acts to try out new material. He also appreciates the opportunity to interact musically with a variety of people. Since joining he's had the chance to perform with several FC members in different combinations in places as diverse as the Northern Virginia Folk Festival, the Oatlands Celtic Festival, and the 35th Anniversary Reunion of the Peace Corps.

What I haven't yet mentioned is that last year Dan volunteered to serve as Editor of this Folk Club Newsletter, and he works hard to see that it gets out by the monthly deadline. Naturally he will be editing this very article that you're reading at this very moment. Some of you will remember that when Dan writes the Showcase interview articles he sometimes asks his subject for an embarrassing story from their past to include in the article. In that spirit, I'd like to conclude this piece with the shocking and extraordinary deep, dark secret that he accidentally revealed during the interview, and that is that Dan --- censored by the editor ---

# **Bonnie Rideout**

Praised by the Washington Post for her soulful, elegant, and virtuoso fiddle playing, Bonnie Rideout is a rising star in the world of traditional Celtic music. A graduate of the University of Michigan School of Music, Rideout is a three-time U.S. National Scottish fiddle champion. She has won scores of competitions worldwide and has performed throughout North America and Europe as a soloist and with other recording artists, including Yehudi Menuhin and Pete Seeger. In

1987-88, Bonnie resided at Armadale Castle, Isle of Skye, Scotland, where she did the research which led to her acclaimed recording of Soft May Morn. Her latest recording, Celtic Circles, has been featured on both National Public Radio and the BBC.

Bonnie is a sanctioned Scottish F.I.R.E. (Fiddling Revival) teacher and adjudicator for Scottish festivals throughout the United States. She has taught courses at the Augusta Heritage Center during Scottish/Cape Breton week, The Swannanoa Gathering, Common Ground, and the Valley of the Moon School of Scottish Fiddling, and was a featured artist at the Oatlands Celtic Festival.

Bonnie often collaborates with other top Celtic performers in this area, including Maggie Sansone and Al Petteway. There are strong rumors of some walk-on guests at Bonnie's performance, but you'll have to show up to find out!
