Mixing originals with songs from traditional and modern sources, the Space Time Gourmets infuse each with a special vision and energy.


Eric Forthman grew up in the Northern Virginia area and is well known to local audiences for his abilities on several instruments, including guitar, bass, mandolin, and fiddle. A talented writer and arranger, Eric is proficient on keyboards and most stringed instruments in a variety of musical styles. He has honed his performance abilities by appearing solo, as well as with several different bands and musical line-ups.

Fritzi began her singing career with the school choir in Alaska. Since relocating to the greater Washington area she

has sung and played guitar in various nightclubs, restaurants, and folk clubs. She has recently expanded to the studio, having been called upon to add backing vocals to several projects.

T.M.Hanna is a self-taught musician and award winning songwriter, originally hailing from the hills of Western Pennsylvania. Heard mainly on mandolin and harmonica, he occasionally adds guitar, bass, banjo, or pennywhistle to STG arrangements.

The synergy of these three eclectic musicians makes any Space Time Gourmet performance a unique experience.

After thirty years of international touring, nine record releases, and main stage credits at every major folk festival in the United States and Canada, Sparky Rucker is now recognized as a leading performer and commentator on African-American folk culture. A Flying Fish recording artist, Sparky is known for his deft abilities as a singer, historian, folklorist, storyteller and down-home humorist. His Civil War and Genealogical research is especially notable, and he is on the Board of Directors and Activities Boards of organizations including the Southern Folk Cultural Revival Project, the John Henry Memorial Foundation, the Labor Heritage Foundation and Sing Out!, the national folk music magazine.

Sparky Rucker, formerly a Chattanooga school teacher, strongly bases his programs on folk history. According to him, "Folk history is the best way for people to learn their heritage because its written by the people that lived the experiences, and people have always been more real than the way they are portrayed in history books." Sparky is a Hurston-Hughes Award winner in folklore and a John Henry Award winner in black American heritage and ballads. In his study of the blues, he has learned so well from masters such as John Shines, Rev. Pearly Brown, Babe Stovall, and Buddy Moss that he was nominated twice for W.C. Handy Awards, and on banjo studied from Homer Walker, the legendary Virginia songster. Sparky has appeared in numerous television programs, such as "The Wild West" from Time-Warner and the "Carry It On" PBS series, and on radio programs such as "A Prairie Home Companion" and "Mountain Stage".

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice!
