Bruce Davies is a versatile and faithful interpreter of traditional and contemporary folk songs. His voice has received much critical acclaim on Radio Scotland, as has his mastery of six-and twelve-string guitar. Bruce's songwriting received national recognition when he won the prestigious Edinburgh Songwriters' Competition in 1995 with the poignant love song A Wish for Me, which has been compared to the writing of Tom Paxton. Bruce draws his material from a variety of sources, initially Scottish folk music, then expanding to encompass a broad range of popular and folk music. Bruce comes from Kingskettle, Fife (near Edinburgh, Scotland), has seven releases there for Rothes Recording, and has just released his first U.S. recording Will Ye No' Come Back Again?

Bruce is well known in the British Isles as part of the popular duo Beggar's Mantle, with fellow Scotsman Bill McArthur, with whom he started playing in the smallest venues and ended up in

2000 seat auditoriums. Since Bruce started his solo career in 1989, he has played over 200 dates a year in the British Isles, Europe, Africa and North America. Bruce is known for his dynamic stage presence and participative approach to the audience. Welcome this national award winning artist to The Folk Club.
