June 10 Showcase - Mike Ball

Mike Ball has been a rare sight at the Folk Club recently, since he's been working in Cleveland most weeks since last November. He's a business analyst for EDS in Gaithersburg, specializing in managed health care computer systems. The Cleveland assignment is ending, and Mike will be returning in style as our June showcase performer!

Mike first picked up a guitar at age sixteen in his native Baltimore, and was a fingerstyle player from the start, learning Freight Train, Railroad Bill, and Don't Think Twice It's All Right. He added banjo two years later, and spent several years focusing on bluegrass. It was in this bluegrass period that he bought his first good guitar, a Martin, in 1973, and did his first flatpicking, with Doc Watson as his model. He now plays about 90% fingerstyle and 10% flatpicking, and still plays banjo, but not usually in the bluegrass style.

Other influences on Mike's playing have been Gordon Lightfoot, Tom Russell, Dale Miller, Pat Donohue, and John Hartford. It was from a Dale Miller instructional LP back in the 70's that Mike learned moving bass lines and alternate chord selection, and John Hartford is the one who showed how to play banjo in various styles. Mike has gone to Merlefest for the last four years, and will be at Augusta for the fourth time this summer to be in Pat Donohue's swing guitar class.

In addition to playing, Mike has been teaching guitar for almost six years, for the last four years at Victor Litz music in Gaithersburg. He'll be conducting a guitar workshop there on June 12 from 8:00 to 9:00 PM (call the store at 301-948-7478 for more information), and is a great source for advice. For example, if you're flying on a commercial airline with your guitar, Mike recommends tapping into the experience found on Pat Kirtley's website at http://www.win.net/~mainstring/carryon.html.

It's less than three years ago that Mike first played in public. It "only took him 27 years (of playing) to sit in front of a mike," he says with a smile, but the experience has been uplifting. Mike was first attracted to the Folk Club by fingerstyle guest artists like Roy Book Binder and Ari Eisinger, liked what he found, and joined. For his showcase he's planning on playing guitar only, no banjo, and debuting six new songs. Vermont based singer songwriter James Mee is often compared to the great storytellers Harry Chapin and Jim Croce, in the manner in which he captures the hearts of young and old with portraits of Americana delivered in a warm, neighborly, acoustic style. His music is so magical it spirits the listener away from everyday laments to a time when beauty and humor forged the fondest memories of our lives. Jim has been playing the New England area for 12 years, and is best known as the author and performer of "Big Times in a Small Town," the title song of Christine Lavin's Rounder Records compilation album, and for "Rhythm of My Heart," which was selected by ABC television for play in their show "Loving." Cherry Lane Music selected James' songs for the national release of "The Best of Contemporary Folk "

The Songsmith of Scottsdale, Arizona, described James' playing "...as I had intended it to be

played, with caring and attention to the audience and his songs, truly a master with both. Captivating the audience with his warm humorous stories as Garrison Keillor does, then melting their hearts with his music. ...his live performance was priceless." James has four recordings and two published works. His music is currently produced by Terry Cashman (Croce's producer), and he is writing music with the legendary Felix Cavilere of The Young Rascals. James has been teamed in performances with the likes of Arlo Guthrie, Shawn Colvin, and Christine Lavin. We believe you will find, as the Acoustic Concerts Under the Stars related, that "from the first notes he threw out a line which quickly hooked, then reeled the audience in."

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice!
