

November 11 Showcase - Don Bridges and Bobbi Bliss



Don Bridges and Bobbi Bliss are the founding members of *Bridges to Bliss*, a songwriting and performing trio that met in 1995 through the Songwriters' Association of Washington (SAW). With David Scales, they do adult contemporary, folk, country, pop, theater tunes, gospel, bluegrass, and children's music. Last year, ten of their songs received recognition in the Mid-Atlantic Song Contest, and they were nominated for four Wammies in the Children's Music category by the Washington Area Music Association (WAMA).

Don, who went to Bowie High School, and then Georgetown and American Universities, is an international programs officer for the Treasury Department. His interest in songwriting started in college,

with a freshman roommate who was a singer/songwriter. The Beatles, Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young, John David Souther, and John Prine have all influenced his style. Among his many other credits, Don is a former songmeister for rugby football clubs, and he also performs solo and with acoustic classic rock trio *Kicking and Screaming*.

Bobbi, a former CPA, now is a full-time musician, singing and running her own recording studio, Bobbi Bliss Music. She sang in various musical theater and choral groups in high school and college, and Richard Rogers was a strong early influence. She was on the board of directors of SAW in 1995, and both she and Don are active in SAW and WAMA.

Don and Bobbi will include a number of different musical styles in their Folk Club showcase, and will be joined for this performance by our own **T.M. Hanna**.

Bridges to Bliss has two recordings of original children's music available, Kid's Songs (1996, which received a Wammie nomination for best children's recording, \$8.95), and Totally for Kids, just released (\$9.95). 
Songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Harvey Reid has honed his craft over the last 25 years in countless clubs, festivals, streetcorners, cafes, schools, coffeehouses and concert halls across the nation. One critic called him the "renaissance man of folk music." He has absorbed a vast repertoire of American music and woven it into his own colorful, personal and distinctive style. His 11 solo albums on Woodpecker Records showcase his mastery of many instruments and styles of acoustic music, from hip folk to country, slashing slide guitar blues to bluegrass, old-time, Celtic, ragtime and even classical.

Reid's skills and versatility on the guitar alone mark him as an important new voice in acoustic music. He won the 1981 National Fingerpicking Guitar Competition and the 1982 International Autoharp Contest. Yet he's also

a solid flatpicker who has won the Beanblossom bluegrass guitar contest, a versatile and engaging singer, a powerful lyricist, prolific composer, arranger, and songwriter.

Reid's 1990 album Steel Drivin' Man was chosen by Acoustic Guitar Magazine in 1996 as one of 10 Essential Folk CD's of all time, alongside Woody Guthrie, Joan Baez and other hallowed names. Reid was included in Rhino Records Acoustic Music of the 90's collection along with a "who's who" line-up of other artists including Suzanne Vega, Richard Thompson, Jerry Garcia, and Leo Kotke.

Reid has become a featured act at many of America's premier concert clubs and festivals, including the Telluride Bluegrass Festival and Walnut Valley Festival. You'll find elements of the traditional troubadour, the modern poet-songwriter, the American back-porch picker, the classical virtuoso, and a good bit of Will Rogers style of dry humor and satire. You'll hear folk, country, classical, blues, ragtime, rockabilly, Celtic, bluegrass, and popular music influences. Reid weaves a vast repertoire of traditional and contemporary songs seamlessly with his own compositions and wry humor.

Musicians - Practicing Schedule News Flash

In the November 1995 issue of this newsletter, I wrote an article on practicing dos and don'ts called The Secret to Good Chops. Part of what I said was that "several short practice sessions a day are better than one long one," and that "something [had] surprised mewhen I practice a new lick several times a day, including just before bed, I wake up the next morning faster and more stable at it. I suspect the brain reinforces the synapses used in the lick during sleep, a type of 'free' practice time."

Johns Hopkins researchers announced this summer the discovery of a process in which motor skills that are being learned are transferred from temporary storage areas in the front of the brain to permanent areas in the back. The process takes five to six hours, during which time learning another motor skill might interrupt the process by reusing the temporary storage areas. This explains why practice just before sleep can be so effective, since the process won't be interrupted, and why several sessions a day are more productive than one. So, science is beginning to tell us why our practice patterns work for us (but, unfortunately, there's apparently still nothing 'free').
