June Showcase - Pat Chen

Pat Chen likes to keep busy. She and her husband Charlie have five children, which would keep most people busy enough, but they also homeschool their kids, and provide day care for more! In addition, Pat runs and practices Zen meditation regularly, and maintains a busy music schedule. She is the organizer of an outreach program that brings music to local retirement communities, and recently played a two-hour solo gig at one. She also heads the group Somos El Mar, which in the last month has played for such diverse events as a women's art exhibit opening at the Reston Unitarian Church, the opening of the Lake Anne Farmer's Market, the Reston Barnes and Noble, and the Herndon Festival.

Originally from Queens, New York, Pat went to the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor. She switched from pre-med to general liberal arts, and specialized in psychology, child care, and teaching young children. After working with emotionally disabled kids in a Chicago therapeutic day care center for six years, Pat moved to Reston, where she did some teaching, volunteered with the outreach support program at the Northwest Mental Health Center, and co-led a teenage drop-in center at Hunters Woods. As her own family grew, Pat cut back on

outside activities but began providing day care in her home.

Pat's musical back-





ground began with several years of piano and violin lessons. She did choral singing in high school, but stopped performing when she went to college. It was the Folk Club that got her started again - after coming and listening for a year, she got behind the mike herself in the summer of 1995, and has been a regular ever since. A singer and fiddle player with a special passion for Celtic music, Pat takes voice lessons from Sheila Egan, a teacher with a background in Sufi singing, recently got a new German violin, and has taken up autoharp as well. For her showcase, she will be joined on guitar by Chuck Boyer. Don't miss it!

Maria Sangiolo - "A singer with a highly revealing style of songwriting and an arresting voice" raves Dirty Linen. Maria is a "born singer" who has made her mark on the folk circuit with her veteran stage presence, poignant songs, timeless melodies, and unforgettable voice. Your Own Road, Maria's latest recording, has gained critical acclaim nationwide with 6 weeks on the Americana charts, voted in WFIT's Best of '96 program and in WGCS' top ten folk CD's. "I was nothing short of blown away" exhorted Geoffrey Huys of WGCS, after seeing Maria for the first time. "Sangiolo's gentle songs stand up to the joy and hurt of life, with the strength to make her optimism credible" (The Music Review).

Maria's first release *Hard Words* in 1992 introduced her to the folk community, and with her first US tour brought comparisons to Carolyn Hester (*Dirty Linen*) and Joan Baez (*The Boston Globe*). Maria released her first CD, *Eyes of the Heart*, in December 1993. Its spare production by **Brooks Williams** gives full reign to the simple beauty of her voice and the timelessness of her songs. Upon its release, *Eyes of the Heart* immediately charted at number one on Boston's famed Folk Radio, WUMB. A year later it was listed in the Adult Trendsetter Radio Top Ten, and later that year resulted in Maria's nomination for a **Boston Music Award** in 1995. For the two independent releases, Maria's fans purchased over 5,000 of her recordings before she had the distribution benefit of a recording company. *Eyes of the Heart* and *Follow Your Own Road* are played on over 300 folk shows across the nation and beyond.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- · win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- · practice, practice, practice!
