September 8 Showcase – Deirdre Murphy


Since her last showcase, Deirdre Murphy has a new job and a good story.

First, the job: after several years at the World Bank, Deirdre now edits medical literature at Eagle Design and Management in Bethesda. She enjoys the work, and loves the shorter commute.

Second, the story: when she was twenty-one years old, Deirdre was playing folk music in assorted, and frequently rowdy, Manhattan clubs. One of them was named 'Himself' by its exquisitely self-referential owner, an Irishman named Malachy McCourt who also wrote a funny drunkalog of a book called *A Monk Swimming*. It was Malachy's brother Frank who recently won the Pulitzer Prize for *Angela's Ashes...* small world, and a good story. She has other stories of that era, too, including the time two gentlemen knelt down and kissed her mini-skirted knees as she sang a sad love ballad in a pub. They're high government officials now, but Deirdre wouldn't identify them further....

If you haven't heard Deirdre's voice before, you're in for a treat. Her lovely soprano has graced everything from operatic arias and the theater to jazz and folk classics. She grew up the youngest of four singing siblings in a very musical family, and could play the Hungarian Rhapsody on the piano at age six. She had seven years of classical voice lessons, and took college courses in music theory and counterpoint. Peter, Paul, and Mary and Judy Collins are her biggest influences in the folk world, and she loves the voices of Anne Hills and Priscilla Herdman. Deirdre has been leaning a bit more toward jazz lately, and listens to pianists and horn players as well as vocalists.


Herndon Folk Festival - Sunday, October 11, 1998 Noon to 5pm

Bill Staines is renowned as one of America's finest singer song writers, evidenced by the number of artists around the world who cover and win recognition with Bill's songs. The Roseville Fair topped this area MusicAmericana listener survey with Makem and Clancy's offering; and second vote going to Nanci Griffith's version. Faith of Man covered Priscilla by Herdman stayed on the WFMA survey chart for years. Anyone not familiar with the music of Bill Staines is in for a special treat; but be forewarned, his shows have sold out in every one of his prior engagements at The Folk Club.

Mason Williams, Grampa Jones, Jerry Jeff Walker on the national scene; the Mill Run Dulcimer Band, Magpie, Mighty Possums, Hickory Grove, George Turman and Side by Side on the regional scene, round out a sampling of artists performing and recording Bill's songs. But the best performer of Bill's music is Bill himself. In 1990 alone, Bill performed at over 200 concert dates; and he has been touring for over 20 years.

Bill weaves a magical blend of wit and gentle humor into his shows, as one reviewer wrote, "he has a sense of timing to match the best stand up comic. His music is a slice of Americana, relecting with the same ease, his feelings about the prairie people of the Midwest or the adventurers in the Yukon." Interspersed between original songs, Bill includes songs ranging from traditional folk tunes to more contemporary country ballads, and delights in having the audience participate in many of the numbers—with *All God's Critters* being a memorable favorite. He may even do a yodeling tune or two, having won the National Yodeling Championship in 1975 at the **Kerrville Folk Festival**. Bill was voted Boston's best performer by The Phoenix and favorite performer by The Boston Globe's annual Reader's Poll in consecutive years. Radio and television performances have included "A Prairie Home Companion", "Mountain Stage", and a host of local programs on PBS and network TV.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice, practice!
