February 9 Showcase: Eric Forthman and Larry Mediate


Eric Forthman and Larry Mediate have been regulars at the Folk Club for so long that they hardly need an introduction. Larry, the Club president, will be playing acoustic guitar and singing, and probably channeling Neil Young for part of the set. Eric, one of the club's MVP musicians, will be on electric guitar.

The two first met when Larry was a child care worker, and Eric was one of the urchins entrusted to his care. They got reacquainted later when Larry was an intake officer for the juvenile court, and Eric, reflecting the benefits of Larry's earlier guidance, was a superstar on the recidivist "A" team. It was on the inside that Eric had lots of time to practice, and he became an ace on guitar, bass, mandolin, fiddle, and license plate stamping machine.


Eric's remarkable ability to rejoin society before receiving the formality of parole led the governor to request Larry's assistance in containing him. It was in this way that Larry got involved in his next occupation as a steelworker, specializing in constructing alloy jail bars strong enough to contain Eric.

Over the course of their continuing acquaintance, a slow realization of common musical interests emerged. The duo began collaborating, specializing in songs of desperate men in desperate circumstances, who still manage to have hope (but not much. really...). They now appear together sporadically as part of Eric's work release program. and the Folk Club is lucky enough to be the beneficiary of their talents for our February showcase.

Lisa is currently touring in support of her debut solo album, Innocent When You Dream, and has appeared at numerous major. "One of the area's freshest acoustic acts!" Lynn Hollyfield and Nina Spruill are known for their intricate blend of harmonies accompanied by guitars, flute and mandolin. A duo to be watched, their live performances are especially engaging; characterized by everything from the very moving to the very amusing. Their repertoire ranges from arrangements original traditional blues/folk contemporary compositions. Their first CD, Slipping Time, released in 1992 garnered high praise from the Washington Post, and included guest artists such as Mike Auldridge and Al Pettiway. The cut So It Goes from the album won third prize in the Mid-Atlantic Songwriters Contest; and in 1993, Lynn and Nina received 5 WAMMIE nominations, and another in 1996 for Best Acoustic Duo.

Their second CD, *Blue & Green*, was released in summer of 1998. Dick Cerri of the World Folk Music Association says "*Blue & Green* shows how much Lynn & Nina have grown (musically) since their first release...their confidence shines through on the new recording..." Dirty Linen says "vocals are extraordinary...lush, polished." KANU radio raves "...beauty is the dominant theme. ...this CD is quietly powerful."

Lynn and Nina have appeared at many festivals and venues, including the prestigious Falcon Ridge Folk Festival and the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts.



Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- •be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- •fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- •win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- opractice, practice!

Club members' performances will be listed in the club calendar, and members' music-related notices (instruction, equipment for sale, etc.) will be listed free of charge.
