July 13 Showcase Ray Kaminsky

Ray Kaminsky wears many hats in the music community. He's a performer, recording artist, booking agent, and festival presenter, and has been a steady hand at the Folk Club for many years.


This month will be typically busy. Ray has other performances besides the showcase (see the In Concert section for a full list), notably including the Herndon Blues Festival on July 24. Ray helped create the Blues Festival two years ago, and has selected and booked Guy Davis, Big Joe Duskin, John Jackson, Roy Book Binder, and Del Ray to appear this year, an amazing collection of talent. This month will also see the re-release of Ray's first recording, Classic Acoustic, in a remastered CD format. That's a lot of hats to be wearing in the July heat, Ray!

Classic Acoustic first came out in the early '90's on cassette tape,

and founding Folk Club member Tim Davis, who now lives in Florida, is doing the remastering. Ray's second recording, the Wammie-nominated Barker Hill Blues, came out in '96, and there are already six cuts in the vault for a third release. Expect to see Web access to samples of Ray's music, and online CD ordering, before long, too!

Ray does all the booking for the Folk Club, and has been booking performers at various venues for over 18 years. He and his wife, Ellen, have made very large contributions of time and talent to the Herndon Festival, and were instrumental in creating the Herndon Folk Festival as well as the Blues Festival. The music community is much richer because of them.




Bill Parsons

Bill Parsons has been delighting audiences with his signature performances on the North American folk circuit since 1993. In that time, he has performed with many of today's marquis names in folk music at many of the top listening rooms in North America and on the European pub circuit. He has sold over 3000 copies of his recordings and built a mailing list of over 2700 fans nationwide. In 1996, Bill performed three shows for the athletes at the Olympic games in Atlanta, and his song "Oslo Blue" was picked up by National Public Radio for use on its Morning Edition program. What's more, the people who know Bill best - the 1500 strong members of the Washington Area Music Association have now honored Bill four times with coveted WAMMIE nominations. Bill is an occasional columnist for Performing Songwriter magazine, and an aide to consumer advocate Ralph Nader. Alan Rowoth of Folk Music Digest says "Bill Parsons is emerging as another one of those songwriter favorites, kind of in the mold of Dave Allen, Gary Frenay or Bob Franke. His strong melodies and interesting lyrics attracted a room full of songwriters as well as presenters [at the 1996 NE Folk Alliancel.

George Turman is a folk singer who has quietly practiced his stock and trade for nearly thirty years. Persisting through times when such classification has meant many different things, he has always held true to the basic premise that, popular or not, folk music is music that will always be shared and enjoyed. The endless debate over what folk music is "exactly" is of little interest to him. Songs that tell stories (some old, some new) and songs that express emotions of points of view, regardless of the source or style in which they are performed, are all folk songs to him.

Turman is a natural on stage. He immediately connects with audiences of all ages and his performances are always sincere and memorable. His rich voice is smooth and engaging, and his guitar accompaniment is rock solid.

George has recorded and produced four albums, composed music for the Discovery Channel, participated in three National Endowment for the Arts to bring music to children, has appeared on NPR's "The Folksampler" and many other television and radio programs, and in theatrical productions at the famed Barksdale Theatre.

Del Rey Del is a master slide guitarist, and has an unbelievably intricate fingerstyle renowned for its counter point melodies, speed and sheer quantity of notes that she delivers from all over the neck of the guitar. Del is known for converting jazz, blues and ragtime piano pieces, such as those from Professor Longhair, into dynamite guitar arrangements. Del draws inspiration from a number of blues divas of earlier years, such as Bessie Smith and Memphis Minnie. Her refreshing arrangements highligh the more obscure gems from the first half of this century.

Guy Davis will take you deep into the blues. With his rough voice, his surefingered and intense guitar playing, his sly sense of humor, and his natural storytellers ease, he has helped rekindle a love of country blues in American music.Guy




performs rich and soulful Delta slide, crisp and bouncy ragtime, and intricate Piedmont pickor dynamic harmonica and foot stomping rhythm. The live album Stomp Down Rider was an immediate hit with critics and blues fans. earning Guy a Top Ten Album of 1995 from the Boston Globe and a Top Ten Blues Album of the Year from Pulse magazine.

Big Joe Duskin

This boogie woogie piano master was born in Birmingham on Feb. 10,1921, the son of a hell-fire Baptist preacher. Reverend Duskin encouraged Joe's first efforts on the family piano, and was pleased to hear him pick up hymns and

service music, but "the Devil's music", blues, was strictly forbidden. When Joe became tempted by this wicked style, he had to post lookouts in order to practice. If one of the neighborhood kids told him that his father was coming, he'd quickly switch over to "Nearer My God to Thee". Jugband music, blues and boogie woogie ing styles while mixing his vocals with mournful were all played in the bars of the West End where Joe grew up. Learning from local artists and from the records of such greats as Roosevelt Sykes, he soon became skilled enough to perform in these bars himself. In the military on U.S.O. gigs he met his idols Pete Johnson, Albert Ammons, and Meade Lux Lewis. In the Forties these men took the boogie woogie form to its highest point of development, influencing many pianists. It was quite a treat for Joe to play with and learn from these three. Big Joe's album Cincinnati Stomp is a must for those who love piano blues!

On most nights, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer gets 12 minutes, including setup time (about 3 songs, usually). A \$1 donation is requested.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase all you have to do is:

- be a Folk Club member (who hasn't done a showcase in 6 months)
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing (held on the night of the previous month's showcase); and
- practice, practice, practice!
