### May 9 Showcase - Deirdre Murphy

So, Deirdre, what's new? "Nothing, really. I lead a very dull, but happy life." She and her husband, Lou Ruffino, are furnishing their winter retreat in Delray Beach, Florida, but other than that "my life is boring."

It wasn't always that way. When she was twenty-one years old, Deirdre was playing folk music in assorted, and frequently rowdy, Manhattan clubs. One of them was named 'Himself' by its exquisitely self-referential owner, an Irishman named Malachy McCourt who also wrote a funny drunkalog of a book called *A Monk Swimming*. It was Malachy's brother Frank who recently won the Pulitzer Prize for *Angela's Ashes*... small world, and a good story. She has other stories of that era, too, including the time two guys knelt down and kissed her mini-skirted knees as she sang a sad love ballad in a pub. Deirdre just kept singing through the genuflecting gentlemen's attentions....

The recent demonstrations at the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank reminded Deirdre of another time in her life which wasn't boring. In 1995, the year of the Bank's  $50^{th}$  anniversary, she was working there when two Greenpeace activists repelled down the outside of the building. As they descended, they unveiled a huge "Bankenstein -50 Years is Enough" banner.

Something else that won't be boring is Deirdre's showcase. She'll be performing some of the old folk songs from the 60's, songs she's never performed at the Folk Club before. If you haven't heard Deirdre's voice, you're in for a treat - her lovely soprano has graced everything from operatic arias and the theater to jazz and folk classics. She grew up the youngest of four singing siblings in a very musical family, and could play the Hungarian Rhapsody on the piano at age six. She had seven years of classical voice lessons, and took college courses in music theory and

counterpoint. Peter, Paul, and Mary and Judy Collins are her biggest influences in the folk world, and she loves the voices of Anne Hills and Priscilla Herdman.

# Michael Smith

Michael Smith is a legend in folk music songwriting, having been recorded by hundreds of artists across the world today. Michael's music and writings were cross fertilized by the work of other prominent musicians in Chicago in the 70's and 80's; folks like Steve Goodman, Bob Gibson, Claudia Schmidt and Cindy Mangsen. In the late 1980's, while still working the proverbial day job, recording for Flying Fish and performing in the Lincoln Avenue folk clubs, Michael was "discovered" by Frank Galati of Chicago's Steppenwolf Theatre Company, who commissioned him to create the music for The Grapes of Wrath, the first theatre production of the novel fully supported by the John Steinbeck estate. The play ran over a year internationally and won a 1990 Tony Award.

Michael's songs for years were listed in the top ten in the World Folk Music Association (WFMA) listeners survey. Michael has three albums on Flying Fish, Love Stories (1987), Time (1994), and Michael Smith (1991). He is the author of the songbooks Songs from Bird Avenue, Michael Smith and Love Stories. Michael has performed at dozens of major folk and music festivals, including the Kerrville Folk Festival, Black Mountain Festival and the Philadelphia Folk Festival. Smith has been featured on WUMB Radio's Circles In The Stream, and in radio interviews with Studs Terkel on Chicago's WFMT, as well as on All Things Considered and Good Evening on National Public Radio and London's BBC. Michael is currently working on a duet project with singer Anne Hills.

#### Folk Club Format

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

#### Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you have to:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months.
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified advertisements, articles, reviews, artwork and other items to Carol Deakin at cd7158@erols.com. All items must relate to music and be emailed in WordPerfect. Information must be received one week before the first day of the month in which you want it published. Items will be printed on the basis of music related interest, timeliness and space available with club information being the first priority.
