June 20 Showcase - "A Cappella" Pete

"A Cappella" Pete Nelson played trumpet for a while when he was young, but since then has chosen to make music only with his voice. He sang in his grade school and high school choruses, and in the choir at the University of Connecticut. Since moving to this area, he has appeared with the Fairfax Choral Society, the Vienna Light Opera Company, and the George Chelena Chorale, and is now gracing the Folk Club with his art. A cappella singing - singing without accompaniment – is quite difficult, and most people trying it find that they don't finish a lengthy song in exactly the same key or on exactly the same pitch with which they started. Pete makes it look easy, but remember he's a professional – don't try this at home!

Over the years, Pete has performed or appeared in HMS Pinafore, Brahms' German Requiem, the Bach Mass in B Minor, the Merry Widow, Die Fledermaus, show tunes, big band arrangements, popular songs from the 20's through the 40's, folk tunes, and the outrageous songs of Tom Lehrer. For his showcase, Pete has chosen to do something new, a selection of children's songs. Several of the songs have animal themes, and you can expect a menagerie including cows, rabbits, octopi, and maybe even a bear or two to populate the proceedings.

The phrase a cappella literally means "according to chapel," performed without instruments "in the style of the church." Looking deeper into the word origin, cappella originally meant a hooded cloak worn by Saint Martin, and in turn the Latin root of that (capp) refers to the head (without which the hood would have been unnecessary). A cappella thus doesn't really describe Pete's music beyond the lack of instruments, for while he has some religious music in his repertoire, like the Bach Mass, his a cappella is hardly apocalyptic. And he puts so much heart into it that the head reference doesn't quite hit the nail, either.

Pete visited the Folk Club after the George Chelena Chorale disbanded, and discovered a place that welcomes his eclectic tastes in music and provides a respite from the ups and downs of life. His regular sets are always highly entertaining, and this showcase promises some magic - don't miss it!



Anyone not familiar with the music of Bill Staines is in for a special treat. For over 25 years, Bill has traveled back and forth across North America, singing his songs and delighting audiences at festivals, folksong societies, colleges, concerts, clubs and coffeehouses. A New England native, Bill became involved with the Boston-Cambridge folk scene in the early 1960's and, for a time, emceed the Sunday hootenanny at the renowned Club 47 in Cambridge. Bill quickly became a popular performer in the Boston area. In 1971, after one of his acts, a reviewer for The Phoenix stated that Bill was "simply Boston's best performer." A decade later, both in 1980 and 1981, the annual Readers' Poll of The Boston Globe selected him as a favorite performer. In 1991, Bill entered his fourth decade as a folk performer with an international reputation as an artist. Singing mostly his own songs, he has become one of the most popular singers on the folk music circuit, averaging 200 concerts per year.

Bill weaves a magical blend of wit and gentle humor into his performances, and as one reviewer wrote, "he has a sense of timing to match the best stand-up comic." His music is a slice of Americana, reflecting with the same ease, his feelings about the prairie people of the Midwest or the adventurers of the Yukon. Interspersed between original songs, Bill also includes songs ranging from traditional folk tunes to more contemporary country ballads and delights in having the audience participate in many of his numbers. He may even do a yodeling tune or two - having won the National Yodeling Championship in 1975 at the Kerrville Folk Festival.

Radio and TV appearances have included "A Prairie Home Companion", "Mountain Stage", "The Good Evening Show" and a host of local programs on network and PBS.

Showcase Performances

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months.
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
