arjorie Myers visited the Folk Club a few times in 1992, before relocating to Dallas. When it came time to come back east, she remembered us and chose to live in Reston, in part because she wanted the club nearby.

Originally from Atlanta, Marjorie got an undergraduate degree in psychology in Georgia and later an MBA in finance and international business from NYU. She worked as a headhunter, then on Wall Street, and now owns an audio/visual equipment rental company that supplies trade shows, seminars, and training sessions all over the country.

Musically, Marjorie was twelve years old, at a Girl Scout camp, when she saw a ukulele and soon

got one. She graduated to the baritone uke, and then to guitar, flute, piano, and voice. Joan Baez was her early idol, and other influences have been Emmy Lou Harris, Fairport Convention, Neil Young, and Pink Floyd. She's been playing at nursing homes every month or two for the last couple of years, and enjoys performing solo, but is looking for some other women to harmonize with. For her showcase, Marjorie will play some flute as well as guitar, and as of press time, will be accompanied by **Ron Goad** and **Dan Grove**. Expect some blues and some rock mixed in with singalongs, ballads, and more. Don't miss Marjorie's showcase!



Bob Franke & Lui Collins



Bob Franke is the epitome of the folk singer-songwriter. He is at the peak of his considerable craft; brimming with the wise and spiritually generous songs for which he is best known, along with wrenchingly convincing topical songs and sugared with the hilarious. His songs are the kind of songs that really do have the power to change the world by being taken into the lives of people. As Tom Paxton says of Franke, "It's his integrity. I always think of Bob as if Emerson and Thoreau had picked up acoustic guitars and gotten into songwriting. There's touches of Mark Twain and Buddy Holly in there, too." Admired by the best in folk, Bob's songs have been recorded by the likes of Peter, Paul and Mary; David Wilcox; John McCutheon; Sally Rogers; Lui Collins; Garnet Rogers and June Tabor. Bob has recorded six albums, with accolades such as #1 Acoustic Recording from Boston's WUMB-FM and Outstanding Folk Album from Boston Music Awards. Bob's The Heart of the Flower was one of the Boston Globe's top ten albums.

Lui Collins has been performing since the early Seventies in the best of New England's many folk clubs, starting out singing covers of Joni Mitchell and Joan Baez, but quickly included then emerging artists Greg Brown, Julie Snow and Stan Rogers. In fact Rogers, the late great Canadian folk singer stated, "She sings my songs better than I do." Lui's six recordings, started with Made in New England in 1978 for Philo, Baptism by Fire in 1981, There's a Light for Green Linnet in 1985. Moondancer in 1993, North of Mars in 1995 and Stone by Stone in 1997 show a steady progression in Lui's work. Her songs explore love, friendship, spirituality, and earthly concerns such as her deepening of ties with Native Americans and her work with prisoners. Dave Von Ronk describes Lui as "One of the best guitaristarrangers I've heard in years", Dirty Linen says "incomparable" and the Boston Globe says Lui is "one of New England's first and brightest stars".

Folk Club Format

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified advertisements, articles, reviews, artwork and other music related items to Irene Boyer at irene@caboyer.com. All items must be emailed in MSWord, WordPerfect, or ASCII text format. Information must be received one week before the first day of the month in which you want it published. Items will be printed on the basis of music related interest, timeliness and space available with club information being the first priority.
