July 9 Showcase - Bob Saunders

Bob Saunders is a native Washingtonian who went to Annandale High School and then the University of Virginia. He lived in California for a while. where he met his wife. He was a masonry contractor for a few years, then got into computers twenty years ago and is now a Vice President at 3Com. The oldest of his four children just graduated from the University of Maryland, and the youngest from Chantilly High School.

Bob's older cousin, who was in the Navy, got him into folk music and guitar at age twelve, playing the Everly Brothers and Peter, Paul, and Mary songs. Bob learned fingerstyle techniques from the beginning, and still hasn't flatpicked a single note. Five years later, when the cousin was stationed in Spain, Bob visited him for two weeks. They spent most nights at a pub that had a Scottish band, and after

closing they'd hang out until dawn to play soccer at sunrise. The band covered a lot of Tom Paxton songs, and Bob got hooked - to this day Tom is his favorite performer.

For a long time, Bob played occasionally, but could go for months or years without picking up his guitar. Then a year-and-a-half ago, he played a friend's Taylor guitar, and the passion returned. He got his own Taylor, and a Breedlove to boot, and has been avidly playing, building up a repertoire of about forty songs so far. Tom Paxton remains his biggest influence, but John Prine and James Taylor are way up there, and he's recently been discovering Kate Wolf and Townes Van Zant.

Bob first came to the Folk Club last August, and thoroughly enjoys it. Don't miss the first of what we hope will be many showcases!



Chuck Pyle's charismatic voice and pumping guitar style combine seamlessly to make a dazzling kind of Southwestern Acoustic rock. His humorous looks into the humanity of us all say the things we've always thought and wished we'd said. A beloved performer, his Zen cowboy character illumines the mind and empowers the heart for one of life's quintessential feel-good moments.

Chuck has lived on the front-range of Colorado for over 30 years and spent most of that time traveling the country playing theaters, festivals, colleges and coffeehouses. He has four albums to his credit and a locally well-known theme song he composed for the 13-part PBS series, Spirit Of Colorado, beamed worldwide by satellite.

Though better known as a performing songwriter whose songs have been recorded by Jerry Jeff Walker, John Denver, The Nitty Gritty Dirt Band, Suzy Bogguss and Chris LeDoux, Chuck has also developed a reputation as a powerful, push-the-envelope guitar stylist, and has taught guitar seminars at such prestigious events as the Puget Sound Guitar Workshop. Chuck is also one of the more popular performers on the singer-songwriter circuit. He is a regular at the Kerrville Folk Festival, and his song Every Day Now was nominated as best song at the prestigious Kerrville Music Awards. He was part of Christine Lavin's Songwriter retreat in Martha's Vineyard that included David Wilcox, Patty Larkin, Pierce Pettis, Cheryl Wheeler, and Cliff Eberhardt. He premiered a one-man theater piece called Zen Gallon Hat (A One-Fact Play) in December '96. Chuck has seven wonderful albums to his credit, including his latest CD Affected By The Moon and a recent re-release of his first album, Drifters Wind. Folk Club Format

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- · win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified advertisements, articles, reviews, artwork and other music related items to Irene Boyer at irene@caboyer.com. All items must be emailed in MSWord, WordPerfect, or ASCII text format. Information must be received one week before the first day of the month in which you want it published. Items will be printed on the basis of music related interest, timeliness and space available with club information being the first priority.
