August 13 Showcase - Tom Shabala

om Shabala was born in Gary, Indiana, and has lived all over the country – Michigan, Iowa, Illinois, California, Georgia, North Carolina, and now Virginia. He spends enough time each year in Florida to count that state, too.

Tom sells construction equipment by day, but likes playing guitar much better. He's been playing since he was a teenager, and wrote a few songs back in high school. He never really stopped playing, but hadn't been doing it seriously until he started coming to the Folk Club. Believe it or not, Tom had never performed before, and never sung into a microphone, before discovering the club, but he's now playing frequently and has started writing again. Cool!

As a kid, Tom's older brothers controlled the turntable, so he grew up listening to their Dylan, Crosby Stills & Nash, and Simon & Garfunkel records. Dylan was a big influence – the first ten songs Tom learned were his, starting with Mr. Tambourine Man. Tom's brothers play music, too, and his kid brother Steve just put out a self-produced CD. Tom played one of the cuts from it – the Rack Song – to critical acclaim at the club, but probably won't do it for his showcase since the ASPCA has been hot on his trail...something about smothered puppies.

For his showcase, Tom will be aided and abetted by such folk club regulars as Harny and Fang, Mark Casale and, if their caseworker allows it,

Al Petteway & Amy White perform an exciting blend of contemporary, Celtic-influenced, original and traditional instrumental music on acoustic guitars, mandolin, piano, Irish Bouzouki, vocals and world percussion. During their live shows, this husband and wife team captures the hearts of their audiences with colorful stories about the places and events that have inspired their music. Al & Amy first began performing and recording together as a duo in 1995 and proceeded to win the 1995 Washington Area Music Association Award (WAMMIE) for "Best New Artist". Since then they were awarded WAMMIEs for Best New Age Group in 1996 through 2000 and Best Irish /Celtic Group IN 1998 AND 1999. They were also Artists in Residence at the Kennedy Center's Millennium Stage.

Al & Amy have recorded an impressive collection of award-winning original and traditional music, both as individuals and as a duo. *Racing Hearts*, their first formal duo recording, won the 2000 WAMMIE for **Best New Age Recording** and their second duo recording *Gratitude* won the 2001 "Indie" Award in the Acoustic Instrumental category from the Association for Independent Music. Both Amy and Al have received Individual Artist Awards from the Maryland State Arts Council for Music Composition and Instrumental Performance. Overall, they have garnered more than three dozen WAMMIE awards and five Maryland State Arts awards.

Al Petteway has played music professionally since he was twelve years old, performing nearly every type of popular, folk and classical music. Though his primary instrument has always been the guitar, he has also studied lute, string bass, percussion and music composition. His recordings, music books, and instructional videotapes have helped win him international acclaim and appearances on National Radio and Television Programs. When he's not performing and recording with his wife, Amy White, Al teaches private lessons in his home studio in Takoma Park, Maryland, and is the Guitar Week coordinator for the world famous "Swannanoa Gathering" music camp at Warren Wilson College in Asheville, North Carolina.

Amy White was born to professional classical musicians and is the youngest of three children. As a result, she was nurtured and surrounded by several genres of music. Despite her upbringing, Amy never mastered sight-reading, and she composes and plays music solely by ear. She has a unique approach to composition and her work reflects this serendipitous combination of classical, jazz, folk, world and environmental influences. Amy's latest solo recording, *Bittersweet, An American Romance*, is a second collection of piano instrumentals featuring Al Petteway on guitar, and Amy's father, retired National Symphony Orchestra oboist and principal English horn soloist, Richard White. Amy, Al and Richard participated in a special Thanksgiving Day broadcast of National Public Radio's "All Things Considered" featuring live performances of the music from *Bittersweet*.

Folk Club Format

On most Tuesday evenings, the Folk Club is an open mike format with a sign-up board. Each performer has 12 minutes, including setup time. This allows three songs if you set up FAST and the songs are of moderate length.

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!

Folk Club members are encouraged to submit performance calendars, classified advertisements, articles, reviews, artwork and other music related items to Irene Boyer at irene@caboyer.com. All items must be emailed in MSWord, WordPerfect, or ASCII text format. Information must be received one week before the first day of the month in which you want it published. Items will be printed on the basis of music related interest, timeliness and space available with club information being the first priority.
