Bob Hampton - January Showcase

Bob Hampton was born in Connecticut, but came to Northern Virginia at age ten and now considers this his home. He went to McLean High School, and has been living in Burke for the last sixteen years. By day he is a computer technician for Open Systems Sciences, but at night he pulls out a guitar and lets the music flow.

In the early 80's Bob played electric guitar and sang in a pop/rock band called Full House, but he went through a period when he didn't play much (particularly since breaking his left index finger in a bike accident in the fall of 2001). Then this past spring he started up again, mostly acoustic this time. He was at Joe Latham's guitar shop in Leesburg when Dianne LaFleur told him about the Folk Club, so he and his nephew stopped by for a visit in August. Hooked! It felt like home to see old friends (all the way back to high school!) Chris and Ken Harnage here, too.

There's a wide variety of music that Bob enjoys, including classical, medieval, and renaissance pieces. The biggest influences on his performing style, though, are probably Neil Young, Cat Stevens, the Beatles, Paul Simon, Jethro Tull, and Jorma Kaukonen - he's spent a fair amount of time on Tull's Thick as a Brick and Kaukonen's Embryonic Journey recently. But a very strong pull, emotionally as well as musically, comes from Galax, Virginia, home of the Old Time Fiddlers Convention, luthier Wayne Henderson, and, for nearly 200 years, Bob's father's family. Bob wrote a song about their old homestead in Galax when his grandfather, who lived to nearly 102, died. The current owners of the property adopted the song, and it was recorded by a Galax group headed by Willard Gayheart, who's also a highly regarded pencil drawing artist (http://www.mtnlaurel.com/Crafts/gayheart.htm). Bob's got some stories, and some of Gayheart's art, that he may share at his showcase, and you can expect a taste of Galax music, as well.

Bob has a non-musical talent that should go over well at the Folk Club, too - he can channel old Firesign Theater sketches with uncanny accuracy. Go on, admit it, many of you know this guilty pleasure yourselves, but just can't pull it off. Bob can. Don't miss his showcase!

Lou and Peter Berryman write songs of inventive and intelligent humor, in a style mingling Woody Guthrie, Gilbert and Sullivan, Tom Lehrer and post-nuclear polka. A fascination with language, a vision of the world both profound and hilarious, and a whimsical and accessible performance leave audiences with cheeks aching from In their more than 20 years of smiling. Wisconsin-based performing together, songwriters Lou and Peter Berryman have produced 11 albums and 2 songbooks worth of original, sophisticated and wickedly funny songs. Berrymans' songs are being sung around the world, by a legion of professional musicians as well as shower singers everywhere, but no one sings them as well as Lou & Peter themselves. Pete Seeger raves "Lou and Peter Berryman! Long may they wave! Their F-word song, "A Chat With Your Mother" is one of the great American folksongs of the 20th century". Tom Paxton relates "When it comes to being funny, I think I've spent the first thirty years trying to be as funny as Tom Lehrer and the last part trying to be as funny as the Berrymans. They don't come any funnier than that...".

Lou Berryman composes and arranges music, sings and plays pianoaccordion and button accordion. Peter writes lyrics and music, sings and plays the 12-string guitar. "He'll usually bring part of a song to me," Lou says, "and we'll do the arranging and editing together, see if its enough of a message to write a whole song about. Sometimes it will turn out that somewhere laying around in our various scraps of things is a chorus or idea that fits to make it a whole song. And I'll set a tune to it; I have to figure out whether to use a sharply contrasting melody or a schmaltzy one to carry the words'. Peter says "We have songs where the contrast between the mood of the melody and the mood of the lyrics is what makes it funny, like the 'The Death and Dismemberment Polka'".

You will have a fun time with this zany duo! Don't miss their performance at The Folk Club.

Because it is a yahoo group, you will have to go through the process of getting a Yahoo address and password, but the good news is that Yahoo won't sell your address to the junk mail, or spam businesses.

How to Find the Newsgroup:

One way to find it is by searching. If you go to Yahoo Groups, mid-page is the "Join a Group" section, click on Music-->Genres-->Folk and Traditional-->Folk and Traditional Groups. At this point you get a list of 399 groups! Who knew there were so many of us! Ours is currently #273. But of course, you could skip all of this nonsense and go

Showcase Performances

On the second Tuesday of each month, we feature a Folk Club member in a two set (25-minute) "Showcase" performance. To be in a showcase you must:

- be a Folk Club member who has not done a showcase in 6 months
- fill out a lottery slip any time in the month before the drawing
- · win the drawing on the night of the current month's showcase
- prepare to be featured in the next newsletter!
