July 8 Showcase – Jim Nagle by Dan Grove

Jim Nagle has lived around here most of his life, with a side trip to the Florida Institute of Technology after graduating from Herndon High School. As a young biology graduate, he did environmental work, and then switched to DNA sequencing in the 1980's. For the past 12 years he's worked at the National Institutes of Health, including a stint in the lab of Craig Venter of human genome fame, and now manages the NIH sequencing facility.

In his spare time, Jim does athletics, including nine Reston Triathlons, seven Marine Corps Marathons, and five Boston Marathons so far (his best marathon time, last fall, is 3:08). He raced motocross in the expert class when younger, and still rides a classic 1974 BMW motorcycle on the road. His wife Lynn and daughters Antonia (7) and Jacqui (5) keep him busy, too. But he still finds time for another true love, and that's music.

Jim got his first guitar at age ten, about the same time he went to a music-based summer camp, then took lessons for several years. He's always returned to music even though events have managed to pull him away occasionally. Jim has explored many guitar styles, both acoustic and electric, including fingerpicking, flatpicking, Grateful Dead-type jamming, and Dobro. Guitar teachers over the years have included Glen Kuykendall, of Bluegrass Unlimited Magazine in Warrenton, and Mike Auldridge of the Seldom Scene. His early musical influences run from the Beatles, Beach Boys, Byrds, Rascals, Who, Dead, Little Feat, Stones, and Jethro Tull thru Tim O'Brien and his all-time biggest hero, Dobro star Jerry Douglas. Jim has also been taking voice lessons from Dee Dee Wyland for the past year.

For his showcase, Jim may be joined for a song by a redheaded Mystery Guest, and you can expect he'll bring more than one guitar. He most likely won't be playing Antonia's Baby Taylor, though, because she charges him rent every time he borrows it. She, Jacqui, and Lynn will probably be there to make sure he doesn't try to sneak it into the act without paying....

Jim appreciates the Folk Club and the opportunities it provides, come share his love of music at his showcase.

This Colorado duo is highly acclaimed for their superb singing, yodeling and comedy. Liz was named 1998 Female Performer of the Year by the Western Music Association, and was given the Patsy Montana Cowgirl Award in 2000. Recently, Liz and Sean performed at the Kennedy Center in D.C., Lincoln Center in New York City, and the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City. Founding members of the Folk Alliance, Masterson and Blackburn have been featured at folk festivals and cowboy poetry events throughout North America. During their 14 years together, Liz and Sean have recorded six albums that blend traditional and contemporary western songs. Their newest release, Western Serenade includes their most requested songs such as Cool Water, El Paso, & Red River Valley.

Their 1998 release, Bord to the Saddle celebrates the songs the silver screen cowboys and cowgirls. Their recording of My Prairie Home was selected for a 4-album anthology of western music distributed worldwide by Rounder Records. Liz appeared on the PBS documentary Yodel - Straight from the Soul. Masterson and Blackburn teach vocals and guitar at Swing Week for the Augusta Heritage Arts Center in Elkins, WV. They have performed with the late Patsy Montana, Riders in the Sky, Johnny Gimble and other former members of the Texas Playboys. Sean Blackburn combines his rich voice with well-timed comedy to deliver a memorable performance. He has been featured on NPR's A Prairie Home Companion, recorded 10 albums of western swing music and is a talented songwriter, in addition to his dazzling rope trick routine. They will absolutely slay you!
